

OUR CATHOLIC VOTE

Responsible citizenship is an obligation of justice. Everyone has a moral duty to vote and participate in the political process for the common good. A Catholic should endeavor to affiliate with political parties that coincide with one's moral conscience and ensure that their policies and platforms do not endorse anything evil. Here are vital issues, non-negotiable values and principles to be a responsible citizen.

- 1. Right to Life
- 2. Freedom of Religion
- 3. Sanctity of Marriage
- 4. Private Property
- 5. Access to Goods
- 6. War and Peace

RIGHT TO LIFE

The right to life is the first and most fundamental right of every human being that comes directly from our human nature made by God. All other rights and freedoms come from this. Injustices such as abortion, euthanasia (assisted suicide), genocide and terrorism deliberately kill innocent human beings.

Similarly, direct threats to the sanctity and dignity of human life, such as human cloning and destructive research on human embryos, are also intrinsically evil. These must always be opposed.

Not all moral issues have the same moral weight as abortion and euthanasia as these directly kill innocent human lives. Without respecting and defending every innocent person's right to life, respecting and defending any other right has no meaning. Another factor to consider in a presidential election is the probable nominations to the Supreme Court that will be made by the candidate who wins as they would impact life and religious liberty issues. Protecting the lives of the unborn, disabled, and terminally ill is the duty of every government. Therefore, one must rate the right to life as the highest issue when voting.

FREEDOM OF RELIGION

Separation of church and state does not mean elimination of religion or faith by government from its citizens. Freedom of Religion (not from religion) includes but is not limited to Freedom of Worship. Faith communities (churches, schools, hospitals or businesses) have the right to follow their moral principles.

It is gross injustice to compel anyone to violate their conscience by mandating the supplying or financing of materials or activities deemed morally offensive (abortion, sterilization, contraceptives). Governments should never coerce or subsidize such immoral population controls at home or abroad. Church leaders have the right to preach, teach and publicly express their faith in accord with their sacred beliefs without interference from government or civil authority.

SANCTITY OF MARRIAGE

The family is the fundamental building block of society. Both church and state (religion and government) depend on families for stability and to provide the common good. Marriage by its very nature is the union of one man and one woman in a permanent, faithful and potentially fruitful relationship.

Family thrives when children are raised with their mothers and fathers living in the same home as husband and wife. Neither church nor government has the authority to redefine marriage to allow same sex, polygamous or adulterous unions as equal alternatives.

PRIVATE PROPERTY

Every person has the right to own private property; hence theft and vandalism are both criminal and sinful acts. Seizing property (possessions, land or money) without serious reason, due process, and fair compensation is a great injustice.

Forced redistribution is not in conformity with the Gospel either. Unsustainable debt, nationally or individually also threatens private ownership, whether now or in the near future.

ACCESS TO GOODS

Due to the fundamental right to life, persons also have the right of access to those goods necessary for the preservation of life (food, clothes, shelter, education, work and medical care). Access means being able to acquire either by affordable purchasing or being in the employ of another in exchange for these essentials.

Unfair wages and depriving an employer of fair work are both injustices. Economic laws and policies must allow for the reasonable access of citizens to what they need by giving them the opportunities to acquire them. We are obliged to assist the poor but help means enabling, not making dependent. Moral governing demands respecting both solidarity (interconnection of all persons as members of the human family) and subsidiarity (nothing should be done at higher/larger/regional level that cannot be done just as well by lower/smaller/local).

WAR AND PEACE

Armed conflict should always be the last resort after diplomacy and sanctions have failed. The Just War Doctrine must be adhered to in all military actions. Deadly force can only be used to repel unjust aggressors.

There must be a reasonable hope of success, use of proportionate means, and always avoiding the direct targeting of non-combatants. Nations have a duty to defend, protect and rescue their citizens from all enemies, foreign and domestic, who seek to cause them harm. The moral character of elected officials is also relevant because good people are more likely to make good prudential judgments, e.g., when and how to engage in a just war.

ATTENTION!!!

Other issues are important but do not rise to the same level as these. When voting ask yourself if the candidate respects these principles and values or do they threaten them? Know where politicians stand on these critical topics and make an intelligent, moral choice.

A Catholic cannot vote for a candidate who supports intrinsic evils, such as abortion, euthanasia, death penalty and other moral issues contrary to the Catholic Church teachings, if the voter's intent is to support those same immoral acts. In such cases a Catholic would be guilty of formal cooperation in grave evil. Voting for them for other reasons (i.e., you do not agree with their position on abortion or other issues) would be material cooperation in evil. If there were reasonable certainty that the candidate will pursue such evil, then voting for him/her would also be cooperation in evil. It is therefore a social sin.

Only when all candidates hold a position in favor of an intrinsic evil, may the conscientious voter vote for the candidate less likely to advance such a morally flawed position and more likely to pursue other authentic human goods (e.g., if both candidates are not 100% pro-life as one favors unrestricted abortions while the other is against most abortions except in cases of rape or incest, one may then choose the latter person who will save more innocent lives).

*These criteria are based on the 2011 USCCB letter "Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship" and the letter from the Sacred Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith by then Cardinal Prefect, Josef Ratzinger (now Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI).



JULY 22 MEMORIAL OF ST. MARY MAGDALENE ELEVATED TO FEAST DAY

Recognizing St. Mary Magdalene's role as the first to witness Christ's resurrection and as a "true and authentic evangelizer," Pope Francis raised the July 22 memorial of St. Mary



In an article for the Vatican newspaper, Archbishop Arthur Roche, secretary of the congregation, wrote that in celebrating "an evangelist who proclaims the central joyous message of Easter," St. Mary Magdalene's feast day is a call for all Christians to "reflect more deeply on the dignity of women, the new evangelization and the greatness of the mystery of divine mercy."

While most liturgical celebrations of individual saints during the year are known formally as memorials, those classified as feasts are reserved for important events in Christian history and for saints of particular significance, such as the Twelve Apostles.

Archbishop Roche explained that in giving St. Mary Magdalene the honor of being the first person to see the empty tomb and the first to listen to the truth of the resurrection, "Jesus has a special consideration and mercy for this woman, who manifests her love for him, looking for him in the garden with anguish and suffering.

"... It is right that the liturgical celebration of this woman has the same level of feast given to the celebration of the apostles in the general Roman calendar and highlights the special mission of this woman who is an example and model for every woman in the church."
