MESSAGE FROM PASTOR ERIC

Promises...Promises...

How good are you at keeping your promises? If we are fortunate, over a span of a lifetime, we will make many promises to friends, family, our work, and even acquaintances. But there are a few promises that take center stage when we think about our Christian faith and life.

I have been thinking about marriage lately. This may have something to do with the fact that my daughter Naomi recently got engaged. could have something to do with the fact that we just celebrated Valentine's Day. Mostly. I am thinking about it in the terms of promises made. One of the things that I will often say when I officiate at a wedding is, "What changes today are the promises that are made." They are promises before God, a community and the couple. I will often encourage a couple to return to the vows they make, reminding themselves of the commitment that they have made to one another. Post them by your bed so you will never forget these promises.

If you were baptized as an infant, parents and sponsors made some promises to you. Or maybe you have made these promises as a parent yourself or as a sponsor at a baptism. The promise is to help the baptized grow in the Christian faith and life. I wonder if we should put these promises on our refrigerators. If you want to see a list of what this entails, check out page 228 in our book of worship the next time you are in church.

But here's the deal. God has made a promise to us as well. That promise, given to us through the death and resurrection of Jesus, is that we will be "clothed with power from on high"

(Luke 24:49). What Jesus is talking about here is the gift of the Holy Spirit. Jesus says these words as he is about to ascend to heaven. What I take from these words is that while we are called to keep our promises, we are not left to our own devices to keep these promises. God is helping us, and is with us in the journey. That is what is promised to us by God.

Maybe we don't talk about what the Holy Spirit is up to enough. But the Holy Spirit is God with us today. So when you are doing your best to keep your promises and live a life that is faithful, remember that you are not alone. When the world seems to be going a different direction than you would have it go, remember you are not alone. I need to remind myself, as I want to remind you, that even our beloved St. Mark's is the Holy Spirit's church. And we are not alone!

As the world swirls around with seeming uncertainty may we take our promises with one another seriously. But even more so, may we trust that the promised gift of God's Spirit with us allows us to know that we are in good hands. God has promised never to abandon us. And for that we can live our lives confident that no matter what passes our way, our future is secure with God. As that old spiritual goes, God's never failed me yet!




