



Where are we today on the grief-to-joy spectrum? How can the Easter Story of the risen Christ heard today and long-awaited through Lent, renew our lives land bring hope and joy to the world?

Next Week's WORSHIP FOCUS

Thomas joins the ranks of those who recognize divinity in Jesus: Simon Peter (Matt 16:13), Martha (John 11:27), and the Roman centurion (Matt 27:54); yet he is the most frequently remembered for his doubts. Maybe that is because we sympathize with him: at times we too have more questions than answers, more doubts than certainty. There is something refreshing in the courage of Thomas to give his doubts voice.

Many people struggle with the stories of the Resurrections. They may seem to stretch our understandings of how things work in the "real world." But does it matter? In the variety of resurrection stories the gospels give us - both on Easter morning and beyond- we are

given a range of ways in which people encountered the risen Christ. As Jesus indicates to Thomas, there are many ways to experience the risen Christ, and we must never let ourselves be limited. What are some ways you have experienced the risen Christ in your life?
