Christmas Challenge to St. Mark's



You are invited to consider a special year end gift to St. Mark's. In October the council approved the development of a Christmas Challenge for the purpose of making an additional payment towards the principle of the mortgage in this present year.

The present monthly mortgage of \$20,000 is sizable and limits what other ministries can be accomplished. Reducing the \$2.6 M debt is an ongoing concern and will be addressed in 2016.

Council members, staff, and some other members of St. Mark's have already contributed \$11,870 toward this challenge. You are invited to join them by matching this gift. Together we can raise \$23,740 towards reducing the principle of the mortgage this year.
