



#### "Another Year Over and a New One Just Begun"



How do you measure a year? Is it big celebrations like: births and baptisms, confirmations and graduations, engagements and weddings, broken relationships and funerals? Or is it perhaps 10,000 little moments of grace? A smile from a friend or a stranger, a pat on the back, a hug, holding the hand of a dear friend, a heart to heart conversation, a baby's laugh, or a parent's sigh.

This is prime Resolution time; big, bold gestures for change. According to Paul Tripp, "Christianity...simply does not rest it's hope in big dramatic moments of change." Tripp suggests that transforming grace takes place in the everyday where you and I live. Change takes place in the routine, in the mundane, and in the ordinary day to day of life.

I'm not saying don't make resolutions in the New Year. Big, bold gestures of change have their place. Rather think about your prayer life. **Prayer transforms us.** You don't have to pray all the time but prayer doesn't need to be confined to Saturday night or Sunday morning. Practice prayer every day and many times a day. I like what Marcus Borg says about prayer, "For me, prayer – addressing God paying attention to my relationship with God – is about reminding me of the reality and presence of God in the course of my day and days. It is about centering more deeply in God and about "opening" to God. It helps me be more centered, more present, more appreciative. I am convinced that prayer changes – that it transforms those who pray."

So as 2015 begins, let's practice prayer. It doesn't have to be big, bold, beautiful prayers just simple prayers like, "Help me" and "Thank you". Pray for help and health and protection for family, friends, and the world. Offer 10,000 little moments of grace every day.
