October 2016 Music Ministry Notes

From the New Director of Music at St. Martin: My name is Stephanie Revard and God has called me to St. Martin Lutheran Church to serve Him in this time and place as Director of Worship and Music.

Did you receive a letter? By now, all church members should have received a letter about serving as Praise Team singers, instrumentalists or choir vocalists.

Meetings have begun: We have begun meetings to assemble Praise Teams (Rehearsals are on Wednesdays at 6:00 p.m.) and Church Choir (Rehearsals will begin on Mondays at 4:00 p.m. starting on October 10 with an Informational Meeting in the Sanctuary for interested choir members.)

Not Musically Gifted? Even if you are not musically gifted, we have needs in the Music Library, Soundbooth, Technology (Powerpoint slides) and Lighting as well as assisting me in various ways with all things music-related.

Music for All Ages I plan to involve worshipping members of all ages (from 3–99+) in Music Ministries during worship. There is something for everyone: including possible children's bell choir (using the colored Kristal Bells), smaller instrumental ensembles, both children's/youth and also adult instrumental ensembles as those gifted in these areas approach me to inform me of their talents, abilities and passions for serving the Lord through Music.

The Focus of Worship

The goal of our Lutheran Worship Services here at St. Martin is to point each worshipper to God's Saving Grace found in Jesus. The primary focus of worship is God's Word and The Lord's Supper. We discover God's will for our lives when we are in His Word. We receive forgiveness of sins and the strengthening of our faith when we receive Jesus' Body and Blood.

Live Music v. Pre-Recorded Production

Because I have a different skill set than our previous music directors, Contemporary Worship will be a somewhat different experience for the congregation as we are now using primarily "live" music led by our Praise Team. This is an adjustment for some and may take some time to understand. In my former congregation, my primary focus was leading the worshipper to God's Word through music.

This will be my focus here, as I know it is the reason God has called me to serve. I will not be making a pre-recorded show during the preceding week to use on Sunday; however, I will be utilizing the wonderful gifts of our musicians as we lead music that points the worshippers to God's Word and the saving works of Christ.

Each month, a contemporary song or hymn will be posted here. Please reflect on the lyrics and how they tie into God's Word and His Will for your life.
