Session Five: Obey - Part 1

Welcome, opening prayer and worship

Introduction

Obedience is one of the most misunderstood and misrepresented aspects of Christianity. Is follow Christ really only about a list of do's and don'ts? If not, why does the list seem so important? In this session, we discover that the confusion comes when we get the steps out of order. Jesus said to: Follow. Believe. Obey.

1. What do we learn about obedience from Jesus' behaviour in this passage? And what do we learn from the disciples' behaviour?
2. Obedience can sometimes be very difficult. What explanation does the passage offer?

1. Was there anything from the DVD that was new to you, or had an effect on you? Did you hear anything that raised more questions in your mind?
2. What keeps people from taking the last step and obeying Jesus?
3. When did you begin to obey Jesus? What was your motivation?
4. What should be our motivation to obey?
5. Has there been a time when you had to make a difficult choice on whether or not to obey God? How did it turn out?
6. Read Matthew 7:24. What are the benefits of doing the hard work of laying a firm foundation for your life?
7. Read Matthew 7:25. When has obeying Jesus helped you weather the storms of life?
8. Of all the Christian commandments that you have heard, which ones have been the hardest for you to apply in your life? What difference would it make if you were to align your life with Jesus' teaching in that area?
