School Commission Corner

The St. Michael School Commission is consultative and advisory in nature. Members meet once a month to advise and support Mr. Geraghty and Fr. Jim as they (Mr. Geraghty and Fr. Jim) form school policies to support the ongoing growth of our parish school. The St. Michael School Commission collaborates with the Pastoral Council and the Parish Finance Council and has liaisons



from these councils attending the meetings.

Last evening, the St. Michael School Commission held their third meeting of the year. The meeting focused on the following topics:

- Bob Colella, Pastoral Council member and liaison to the School Commission, provided an update concerning the St. Michael Parish Strategic Plan. The Pastoral Council has approved our request to form a School Commission subcommittee to draft project proposals involving the school that are aligned with the strategic initiatives of the strategic plan. A subcommittee of St. Michael teachers and School Commission members is now being formed to develop these proposals.
- The Pastoral Council would like to invite school parents to help build a database to categorize the parishioners' ideas related to the strategic initiatives. The ideas are contained on slips of paper and need to be digitized through a database for efficient access. Please contact Mr. Geraghty if you are interested in sharing your time and talents by joining this project. School or parish service hours will be provided!
- School Commission members completed an important survey for our accreditation self-study.
