We are offering you a gratitude gift of a waived registration fee when a new family registers and indicates that you referred their child to our school. There are some exciting new additions to our Catholic Schools Week schedule that you will see on the calendar next week. We will be holding our first ever *National Geographic School Geography Bee*. This competition is for students in grades 4-8, with preliminary rounds held in the classrooms. The top qualifiers from each class will compete against the other 4th-8th graders who have qualified at an all-school assembly during Catholic Schools Week. 
SCHOOL FEES REMINDER
