Our winter MAP testing for students in grades 2-8 has officially concluded and we are currently studying the scores. I am so proud of our students' perseverance through these tests during this difficult cold and flu season. As we study this winter testing data, we have learned that the Northwest Evaluation Association (NWEA) does not consider winter assessments to be an official growth point due to the limited number of instructional weeks. Rather, NWEA views these winter assessments as a useful barometer of student progress in preparation for the final MAP assessment in the spring. With this view in mind, our students will use their winter MAP results to set learning goals in preparation for spring assessments this May. Teachers will send home the winter results with the learning goals within the next few weeks to gather your signature so that you can support these important goals.


Last evening, the St. Michael School Commission held their fifth meeting of the year. The meeting focused on the following topics:
