Shrove Tuesday, Feb. 12, 6:30 p.m....Bring: something to share for the potluck: Your sense of humor; Your palms and palm crosses from last Palm Sunday: What goes on: dinner, singing, The Shrove Tuesday Game, beads and

masks, a lot of laughter - followed by the burning of the palms and the burial of the Alleluia

Ash Wednesday, Feb. 13, 12 noon and 7:00 p.m....The traditional Ash Wednesday service with imposition of ashes and Holy Eucharist. The evening service includes the choir.

Why: We begin the season of Lent with a startling reminder of the brevity of life, encouraging us to be intentional about our journey.

Saturdays in Lent, beginning February 16 – 8:00 a.m....Bring: work gloves, hats, a willingness to help. What goes on: breakfast and Morning Prayer, followed by a morning of work around the St. Paul's campus

Every Day of Lent – Feb. 13- March 30...Pray one of the small offices in the Book of Common Prayer; short offices of morning prayer, noonday prayer, evening prayer, and night prayer begin on page 137 of the prayer book. Commit to at least one office a day – they take about five minutes. Join in the church's work of prayer for the needs of ourselves, our community, and our world.

Every Day of Lent and Easter – Feb. 13- May 19...Set aside money for our mission project for Lent and Easter: Habitat for Humanity. Our fundraising goal is \$5,000, which represents the cost of a Habitat single-family home in Nicaragua. Consider setting a goal that's based on some discretionary money you already spend: instead of a latte, put the price of a latte in your Habitat envelope. Instead of going to the movies, put that money aside for Habitat. You may also want to consider a weekly gift for this period, designated for Habitat. We can make a significant difference for a family in need of a livable house!

The Eight Habits of Love, Sundays at 11:00 a.m.
February 17 - March 17
David Milligan, Presenter

During the five Sundays of Lent, David Milligan will present a class based on Ed Bacon's (Rector of All Saints Pasadena) new book, "The Eight Habits of Love." This book is a practical invitation to move beyond the fear-based life that marks so much of our culture. It offers love as a liberating, joy-filled guiding force.

These eight simple habits - play, forgiveness, stillness, truth, candor, compassion, community and generosity - have the power to change the way we think and behave. Based on these 8 Habits we will look at some important questions such as: How do I know I'm living the life I should be? How do I forgive those who have hurt me?

How do I talk candidly with difficult people? How do I best help others when they need it? And How do I let go of the past and move forward?

The book is filled with engaging stories and wisdom. And although we heartily recommend reading the book, it is not necessary for attending the class.

The "Welcome Table" is for everyone!...Beginning on the first Sunday of Lent, February 17, at 11:00 a.m., Kay Sylvester will lead a class called "The Welcome Table", an in-depth introduction to the Episcopal Church. Topics will include history, sacraments, polity, spirituality, the Bible, the Book of Common Prayer, the worldwide Anglican Communion, the emergent church - and more!

This class is for you if:

- You wonder why we do the things we do in worship.
- You have come to St. Paul's from another tradition.
- You have come to St. Paul's with no church background.
- You are interested in Confirmation.
- You like classes.
- You'd just like a refresher on some of our traditions.

Join us for any and all classes. If you are considering confirmation/joining the church, you will need to attend all the classes if possible.
