During the five Sundays of Lent, David Milligan will present a class based on Ed Bacon's (Rector of All Saints Pasadena) new book, "The Eight Habits of Love." This book is a practical invitation to move beyond the fear-based life that marks so much of our culture. It offers love as a liberating, joy-filled guiding force.

These eight simple habits - play, forgiveness, stillness, truth, candor, compassion, community and generosity - have the power to change the way we think and behave. Based on these 8 Habits we will look at some important questions such as: How do I know I'm living the life I should be? How do I forgive those who have hurt me? How do I talk candidly with difficult people? How do I best help others when they need it? And How do I let go of the past and move forward?

The book is filled with engaging stories and wisdom. And although we heartily recommend reading the book, it is not necessary for attending the class.

Bp. Krumm Scholarship...The Ides of March -- not a good day for Julius Caesar, but a great one for the Krumm family, who welcomed son John McGill Krumm, who became Episcopal Bishop of Southern Ohio, Bishop of the American Episcopal Churches in Europe, and spent his last years as Bishop in Residence here at St. Paul's. He was acknowledged as a constant champion of women and education.

His faith and works are memorialized here, with The Bishop John McGill Krumm Scholarship -- a unique award that helps a mature woman in mid-career improve her position in today's workplace by helping her to complete the final steps of the plan she has made and followed to secure additional education or training. Now in its 17th year, we welcome applications for this \$2000 award which will be presented on Sunday, March 10 at our 9:30 service.

Applicants need not be members of St. Paul's, but **MUST** be nominated by a member of this parish. Application packets
