### Bits & Pieces

Dear Friends,

After a long period when few changes took place in our worship space and in our liturgy we are about to encounter a veritable whirlwind of change. Ever since Trinity Sunday we have had the same liturgy in place and we have used the same paraments. Now, within a seven week period we will see the colors of our paraments move from green to red to white, back to green for two weeks, then to white and finally the blue of Advent. (Be sure to thank our Altar Guild participants!) All of that occurs because while we are still in the season of Pentecost until the end of November, the feast days of Reformation Sunday (October 28) and the Sunday of All Saints (the first Sunday in November) take precedence. In a similar way the last Sunday of the season of Pentecost, Christ the King, uses white. From then, it is seven days to the first Sunday of Advent when we use blue. The liturgies we use during this time will not be in quite the same flux but the routine we've become used to will be left behind for awhile.

Another part of our routine for this time of the year will also change. If you remember, we began to consider about two years ago the change in timing of our annual meeting and elections. No late November- early December congregational meeting takes place this year. No buzz about the upcoming budget. All of those take place this coming spring. But there is one event that will remain the same.

Last year we held a stewardship event on the first Sunday in November in which all of the members were asked to reflect upon the grace of God and the role that grace plays in their lives. I don't believe that grace and stewardship are often perceived as belonging together. But the stewardship committee has been working very hard for the last couple of years to show just how strongly stewardship is tied not to guilt but to grace. For much too long the manner in which most stewardship has been presented has come from the direction of what one should do or give. The committee believes that if we would but consider for a moment what God has done for us through our Savior Jesus Christ, what God has done and continues to do for us, we could move from guilt to gratitude.

Congregation members will soon receive a letter from me. That letter will invite us to make a written promise which may then be brought to church on Sunday, November 4. During the latter part

of each service the promises will be collected with others and offered as a whole offering and burnt. This act gives each of us an opportunity to intentionally offer ourselves, and what we call ours, to God. Such an action has the capacity to help us recognize anew God's grace, love and generosity in our lives.

There are some benefits to cooler weather. One other noticeable difference around St Paul's is that with the fall season, coffee hours have switched from after the 8:00 service to after the 10:30 service. On behalf of the council I would like to extend a thank you to all of you who have signed up to host a coffee hour or plan to do so in the coming months. ## Earthquake Guide for Motorists

Most of us are familiar with the techniques of responding to a quake while indoors, but how should one respond is an earthquake occurs while driving. Given the amount of time we spend traveling, we should be prepared for a major emergency. Here are a few safety guideline:

- Gradually decrease speed
- Pull to the side of the road when it is safe to do so
- So not stop on or under bridges or against walls
- Avoid parking near trees, downed power line, and buildings
- Stop the car and keep your seatbelt fastened
- Remain in your car till the shaking stops; keep that in mind as aftershock do occur
- Turn on your car radio and listen for advisories
- if driving on the freeway and it is safe to do so, exit at the first opportunity

### Keep in your vehicle:

- First aid kit, bottled water
- Non-perishable food (energy bars)
- Blanket/sleeping bag, flashlight
- Fire extinguisher
- Tissue and pre-moistened towels
- Extra shoes, coat
- sealable plastic bags
- gloves and toiletries
