Have You Had Your Faith 'Booster Shot'?

We have once again entered the season of autumn. A change of seasons offers a time for me to reflect upon my life: how are things with me

spiritually? Where am I? Am I walking close with God? Or have I wandered astray, wandering off in some other direction?

It is at these times of reflection that I realize that I need my regular 'booster shot'. You probably got some sort of 'booster shots' as children. You probably had your kids get their 'booster shots, as well'. These shots help to inoculate us from diseases, from those things which may harm our bodies and make us really sick. Whether it's before the start of a school year or before the start of cold & flu season, we seek out these shots to give our immune systems a 'boost', especially at times when our immune system will be especially stressed.

During times of spiritual reflection, when I feel that I might be in need of a spiritual 'booster shot', I turn towards God's word as found in the Bible and as it is spoken and written through writers and thinkers throughout the centuries—up to and including the present day. One of the reasons that it is important for congregations to have healthy 'Christian Education' or 'Faith Formation' ministries is to provide people with a 'booster shot' of knowledge that can help expand your mind to see what God is doing among us and in our community. Faith Formation can also give your faith a 'boost' at times when your faith is put under stress.

Right now, at St. Paul's, there are several 'Faith Formation' opportunities for people of all ages. These can enrich your knowledge and can provide a much needed 'booster shot' to sustain you on your faith journey. Some are already underway and have

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been well-advertised: the monthly 'Bread & Belonging' potluck and presentations; Sunday School for all ages—beginning with Kid's Church at 9:15 am; the book study Vicki Hamilton leads on the 1st Tuesday of the month at 9:30 am. But there are other new opportunities that are about to start or are in the planning stages and will start in a few weeks. Among these new 'Faith Formation' opportunities are:

<u>Youth Group</u> – the high school youth group has been meeting on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of the month at 12:00 noon. The youth group will continue to 'check-in' with each other and plan future events with youth group leader, Traci Angel. In addition to this, Traci & I will be leading a time of learning and discussion about faith & contemporary issues faced by teens. The teens themselves will let me know what these issues are! But then, I hope to guide a discussion based upon where these issues and topics intersect with our faith journey. There will be some Bible study, some 'Confirmation' review, and questions—LOTS of questions, I hope—to help guide our conversation.

'Confirmation Experience' - St. Paul's 'Confirmation Experience' (NOT 'class', because there is so much more that just 'classroom'-type learning in our faith journey!) will begin in November. We will gather on the 1st and 3rd Sundays of the month, after Coffee Fellowship. There will be a meal provided, followed by a time where we explore the Bible, learn about our faith traditions, learn about what our neighbors of other faiths believe, and learn about core Lutheran beliefs as found in Martin Luther's Small Catechism. Deanna Fine will be assisting me in lesson planning and in some of the instruction, and parents will be providing support in terms of helping with meals, sitting in and learning with their kids the core of the Lutheran faith, and a willingness to assist in other ways. Confirmation Gathering will be on Sunday, Nov. 4th, beginning at 12:30 p.m.

<u>'The Lutheran Course'</u> – Starting later this month, I will begin facilitating a kind of Confirmation 'refresher course' for anyone interested in brushing up on their knowledge of Lutherans teaching and beliefs. This class will also be the class those who wish to become members of St. Paul's will take to prepare one for membership. We will be using The Lutheran Handbook, published by Augsburg Fortress, as our primary book, along with optional books one may purchase to get a more in-depth knowledge of Luther's Small Catechism and Lutheran theology and doctrine.

There is another 'Faith Formation' opportunity that I would like to see resume. Right now, due to my workload, I am unable to facilitate / coordinate the Men's Group fellowship and Bible study. I am looking for men within our congregation who would be willing to get the Men's Group restarted. I am also looking for those willing to assist me in leading the Men's Group Bible studies. Once we get someone to be the Men's Group Facilitator, the Men's Group will once again be meeting on a regular basis. I will assist the facilitator in planning and leading the Men's Group Bible studies and events—you will not be left out on your own!

Please prayerfully consider giving your faith life a 'booster shot' by participating in, helping to lead, or facilitating a 'Faith Formation' opportunity this fall!

#BeThe1To is the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline's message for National Suicide Prevention Month and beyond. Lifeline network suggests the following actions "to promote healing, help and give hope".

Ask: Research shows that people feel relief when someone ask after them. Also, findings suggest that acknowledging and taking about suicide may reduce suicidal thoughts.

Keep Them Safe: Studies have indicated that when the tools are made less available, suicide rates by that method decline.

Be There: People are more likely to feel less suicidal, less overwhelmed and more hopeful after speaking to someone who listens without judgment.

Help Them Stay Connected: Studies indicate that creating a network of individuals and resources for support can help take away feelings of hopelessness.

Follow Up: Studies have shown that short, low cost intervention and supportive ongoing contact may be an important part of suicide prevention.
