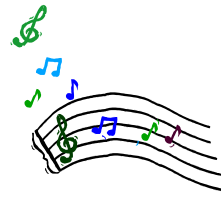

ST. PAUL'S FAMILY PORTRAITS

Introducing **Sarah Gail (Nichols) (Smith) Jevne**

Sarah Gail Nichols was born March 6, 1939, in Green Bay, Wisconsin. Her paternal grandfather had emigrated from Pomerania (Germany) to the USA in 1888. Her father, Gaius Lyle Nichols (12-08-1901 to 2-21-1979) was of German (1/2), English, and Scottish heritage. He was a dairy farmer, then raised beef cattle near Oconto, WI, and worked for the Rural Electric Administration. Sarah's mom, Lillian Gertrude (Wilson) Nichols (5-16-1908 to 3-25-1993) was of German, English, Scottish and Irish heritage. After graduating from Bellin School of Nursing as an RN in 1931, Sarah's mom was a nurse for the children of the Governor of Mississippi and then became a housewife.

Sarah is the oldest of three children. Her brother, Lyle Nichols, born 9-12-1943, lives on the family farm in Oconto, WI, that his grandfather had purchased from P. T. Barnum in the 1890's. Her sister, Jennifer Nichols, born 8-31-1952, lives in Lakewood, WI. Sarah attended first grade at Brookside School (2 rooms); grades 2-8 at Green-

wood (1 room), followed by graduating from Oconto High School in 1957 as Valedictorian. She was active in sports, home economics, choir, and 4H Club for eleven years raising, showing and selling beef cattle. In Social Studies, she began her life-long interest in genealogy. She attended the Union of Christian Friends Church (Methodist), which closed, so she became a member of Norwegian Trinity Lutheran Church. Sarah attended Bellin Memorial Hospital School of Nursing in Green Bay, WI, graduating in 1960. She and her mother were the first mother/daughter to graduate there.

Sarah moved to Madison, WI, worked at University Hospital and achieved a Bachelor of Science Degree in Nursing in 1964 from U W Madison where she was a member of Alpha Tau Delta Nursing Fraternity. She met and married Bob Smith on 7-21-1962. He was a self-employed house builder. He was treated for cancer, then in remission for five years and died at age 40 on 2-7-1969. From 1964-1974, Sarah taught Medical Surgical Nursing at Methodist Hospital School of Nursing until it closed. She was active in the Madison District Nursing Association, the Wisconsin Nurses Association (second VP for 2 years), and Wisconsin League for Nursing. Sarah got within ten credits of getting her Masters Degree in Adult Education which she did not pursue later.

In 1969, Sarah met Leonard (Len) Jevne who had his own construction company, building homes. He had two children: a daughter, Rosalind Hack (WI and CA), who has two sons; and a son, Eric (Madison, WI), who also has a son. Sarah and Len married 5-23-1971 in Las Vegas, NV, but lived in Middleton, WI, outside of Madison. They joined St. Luke's Lutheran Church where Sarah became president of the women's group (ALCW), sang in the choir, and was a "quilter" making quilts for Lutheran World Relief. From 1970-1985, Sarah was a member and president of the Madison Junior Women's Club and was also a 4H leader in Middleton for seven years.

Sarah and Len have two sons: Nicholas, born 4-18-1972, lives in Menasha, WI, where he is the assistant manager at the Wreath Factory and Otter Creek Outdoor (home, garden, landscaping, etc.); and Russell, born 10-12-1973, who is now finishing his Masters Degree in Business Administration at U W Oshkosh in WI. He will be studying in London, England, for approximately one year and Sarah is currently on a vacation in London. Len retired in 1975, and because they liked Nevada, they moved to Carson City in July of 1987. They joined St. Paul's Lutheran Family and sons Nick and Russ were confirmed here. Sarah has been very active in our church choir (20 years) Altar Guild (18 years), VP of WELCA, and LEE Group (president 3 years). (*Note: LEE first met in the Sorlien Hall kitchen and then moved into the new Friendship Hall facility upon its completion in 1995*).

Sarah started St. Paul's Quilters (now called St. Paul's Stitchers) around 1977 when Advocates to End Domestic Violence asked our church to provide quilts for children in their shelter. To date, 924 quilts have been made and given to "Advocates", newborns in our church, and others. This small group also knits/crochets lap robes and prayer shawls for nursing homes and others within our church, as well as bonnets and booties for newborns at Carson-Tahoe Hospital. Sarah has also been a leader of the Carson City Community 4H Club and the Model Rocket 4H Club.

Sarah and Len traveled in their motor home to most states and Canada. They were members of the Reno Prospectors Club that looked for gold many times in NV and CA (never found much but had interesting times!) Sarah has traveled to the UK, Germany, Netherlands, Belgium, Central and South America, and she and Len vacationed in the Caribbean and also took a cruise to Alaska in celebration of their 25th wedding anniversary.

In January of 2004, Len had a heart attack and was later diagnosed with Alzheimer's disease. Many of us observed that Sarah was the most dedicated caregiver to Len until his passing on October 21, 2009. Sarah continues extensive research on the genealogy project, new technologies, photography, crafts, travel, stitchers, choir, LEE Group, etc. We thank Sarah for her years of dedication to serving church and community activities wherever needed. May God bless her in all aspects of her life.

One of the most enduring myths about Independence Day is that Congress signed the Declaration of Independence on July 4, 1776. The myth had become so firmly established that, decades after the event and nearing the end of their lives, even the elderly Thomas Jefferson and John Adams had come to believe that they and the other delegates had signed the Declaration on the fourth. Most delegates actually signed the Declaration on August 2, 1776. In a remarkable series of coincidences, both John Adams and Thomas Jefferson, two founding fathers of the United States and the only two men who signed the Declaration of Independence to become president, died on the same day: July 4, 1826, which was the United States' 50th anniversary.

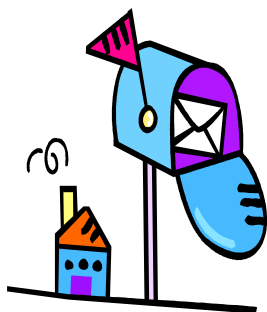
