Dear Friends,

What follows is stimulated by an article given to me by Vicki Hamilton written more than 30 years ago. The original piece addressed confirmation and changes that were taking place at that time within Lutheran churches.

The article opened with a concern that many Lutheran congregations were actively considering the possibility of "doing away" with confirmation. A subsequent paragraph addressed the need to see confirmation as something other than just a means of preparing students for communion. At the time the original article was written many members of Lutheran congregations, perhaps recalling their own experience (ordeal?), felt confirmation was the gateway and/or payment made to receive communion. The behavior of many members of Lutheran congregations corroborates that perception. I still occasionally hear suggestions, sometimes made mock seriously, sometimes not, that confirmation students should stand before the congregation and face a barrage of questions from their "betters" to ascertain the students worthiness of becoming fully accredited members of the congregation and suitable recipients of the Eucharist. Such an understanding misunderstands the goal of confirmation and simultaneously undermines the nature of communion.

What is the goal of confirmation? The article continues in the following way: "that we realize that we are all learners (emphasis mine); that we build respect for the Church, its leaders and each other (emphasis from the original article); learn to read, study and interpret the Bible; build good feelings about the church, have social/fellowship times; have times for serious discussions; (to investigate the) purpose of worship and (the student's) participation (in it); understand God and the love that God has for each individual; learn and understand the mission of God's church; learn to work together as a group; and (to provide) time to build a relationship between the pastor and these young people." Not bad; not bad at all.

Now, if we might find a way to convince the "adults" that most, if not all, of these goals also pertain to them.

Unless therefore, I am convinced by the testimony of Scripture ... I cannot and will not retract ... Here I stand, I can do no other. So help me God, Amen."







ST. PAUL'S FAMILY PORTRAITS

Introducing **JUDITH ELLEN (GOSCH) WEBSTER**

Judith Ellen Gosch was born September 3, 1941, in Ute, Iowa, population 350, which is in western Iowa near Omaha, Nebraska.

Judy's paternal and maternal grandparents came from Germany in the late 1800's. Her father, Glenn Edward Gosch, was born 5/18/1916 in Iowa. Her mother, Marjorie Ellen Green, a twin, was born 10/20/1920 in South Dakota. They married in 1940 and lived in Ute. They raised field crops, such as alfalfa, corn and grains for sale and raised milk cows for dairy products for the family. Later, her father worked selling farm implements.

The Gosch's had three girls. Judy is the oldest, then Carolyn, who lives in Ayr, Nebraska, and Diane, who died four years ago at age 63. Judy's mother passed away in 1947 at age 27 from tuberculosis. Later, Judy's father married Luella Waderich, whose husband had been killed by lightning. She brought two girls to the marriage, Phyllis and Doris, who live in San Jose, CA. Glenn and Luella had a daughter, Norma, who lives in Elkhorn, IA.

Judy attended Ute Grade School and High School through her junior year, which was housed in one building. Some years she was bussed to and from school. There were about 200 students because they came from surrounding farms and communities.

Judy was baptized and confirmed in the Missouri Synod, LCA. In all locations throughout her lifetime, she has attended Lutheran churches. In her senior year of high school, the family moved to LaMoille, IL, south of Chicago, where she graduated from LaMoille High School in 1959. She worked one summer in Chicago.

In 1960, she joined the U. S. Air Force and attended basic training in San Antonio, TX. She was sent to Barksdale Air Force Base in Shreveport, LA. She met Joseph Garvin Webster, who was also stationed at Barksdale and they were married on 5/28/1961. When Judy and Joe were expecting their first child, Judy had to leave the military after serving two years. Their daughter, Michelle (Shelly) was born on 3/5/1962 and Jennifer was born on 9/21/1964. Joe was honorably discharged in 1964.

The family moved to Akron, OH, where Joe worked in quality control in a foundry. In 1970, they moved to San Jose, CA, where he continued in quality control in the electronics field. In 1980, they moved to Carson City, NV, where he worked for two companies which no longer exist. They found a home in the southern portion of Carson City where they still live, but which is served by Douglas County. Judy worked for the Carson City School District for 14 years, first as a teachers' aide in special education, then in the ESL program at three elementary schools: Seeliger (1 year), Fritsch (3 years), and Empire (10 years), retiring in 2002.

When they arrived in Carson City in 1980, they joined St. Paul's Lutheran Family where Pastors Kenneth Bergmann served from 1977-1984; Doug Thunder from 1984-1985; Ruth Hanusa from 1985-1991; and Stan Pesis from 1985-present. Judy taught Sunday School for a few years. Sadly, Judy's stepmother, Luella, died in 1999 and her father, Glenn Gosch, died on 6/14/2000 at age 84.

Judy and Joe's great grandson, Cody Joseph Lopez, has lived with them since he was a baby. As an eight-year-old, he is involved in soccer several nights a week and Cub Scouts where Joe is involved in his activities, such as campouts, etc. Cody loves Legos, Nintendo, and the computer. Judy and Joe love him and cannot imagine life without him.

Judy and Joe's family all live within the Carson City area, including two daughters, five grandchildren, and three great grandchildren. Shelly has one daughter, Yvette, and two sons, William and Justin, and is married to Bob Stevens. Shelly is one of St. Paul's Sunday School teachers. Jennifer has one daughter, Samantha, and one son, Travis. She has worked at the Sheriff's Office for five years.

Judy's "therapy" for 30 years is a flower garden, while Joe tends to the vegetables. She loves to read, bake goodies, care for their Chihuahua-pug dog and the once-a-month get together with friends to eat and play Scrabble. They enjoy their trips to a time share in Mexico. They are planning a trip next year to Disneyland, plus they will celebrate their 50th wedding anniversary in May 2011.

Judy, we thank you for your lifetime involvement and commitment to Lutheran churches. We applaud you for your leadership, strength and passion in maintaining strong family ties and loving relationships. May God bless you and your family.

Dear Friends,

With Paul and Mary Jo on vacation, Paul asked me if I would bring the congregation up to date on the September Church Council meeting. There were three things that dominated the working portion of the meeting.

One, the 2011 proposed church committee budgets were due this week. As you probably know, this time of year the council is deeply involved in preparing next year's financial outlay, which is really based upon your, the congregation's, input, and last year's budget against the amount of revenue taken in. In order to produce a budget that is as accurate as possible the council has scheduled two council meetings for the month of October, plus ongoing budget committee meetings this month. We urge all who are involved in committee budget discussions, or wish to be involved, please attend the council meetings or any of scheduled budget meetings.

Which brings us to the second working point of the September council meeting; our budget committee has projected that that St. Paul's Lutheran Family will be approximately \$8000 short of projected revenue for the 2010 budget. We will need everyone's help meeting our goals for this year.

The third issue that must be addressed is that we need volunteers for Sunday school desperately. Our church vacation bible school was a huge success - please help keep this momentum going.

In closing I would like to quote from another Paul. St Paul, in his letter to the Romans, "We have gifts that differ according to the grace given to us: Prophecy in proportion to faith; ministry, in ministering; the teacher, in teaching; the exhorter, in exhortation; the giver, in generosity; the leader, in diligence; the compassionate, in cheerfulness."


