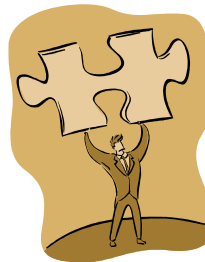

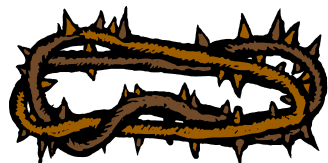
ANNUAL EASTER SHOE PROGRAM

THOUGHT PROVOKING



THE BUZZARD - if you put a buzzard in a pen that is 6-feet by 8-feet and is entirely open at the top, the bird, in spite of its ability to fly, will be an absolute prisoner. The reason is that a buzzard always begins a flight from the ground with a run of 10-to-12-feet. Without space to run, as is its habit, it will not even attempt to fly, but will remain a prisoner for life in a small jail with no top!

THE BAT - flies around at night and is a remarkable nimble creature in the air, but cannot take off from a level place. If it is placed on the floor or flat ground, all it can do is shuffle about helplessly and, no doubt, painfully, until it reaches some slight elevation from which it can throw itself into the air. Then, at once, it takes off like a flash!

THE BUMBLEBEE - if dropped into an open tumbler, will be there until it dies, unless it is taken out. It never sees the means of escape at the top, but persists in trying to find some way out through the sides near the bottom. It will seek a way where none exists, until it completely destroys itself!

PEOPLE - in many ways, we are like the buzzard, the bat, and the bumblebee. We struggle about with all our problems and frustrations, never realizing that all we have to do is look up! Sorrow looks back, worry looks around, but faith looks up! Live simply, love generously, care deeply, speak kindly and trust in our Creator who loves us!

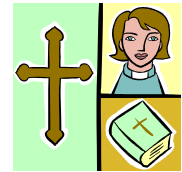

May Christ's blessing be upon us all; in all our endeavors this month and in the future.

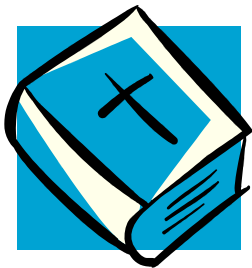
Our new Choir Director is Shawna Lynch, please take time to congratulate Shawna and her new accompanist Mike on their appointments.

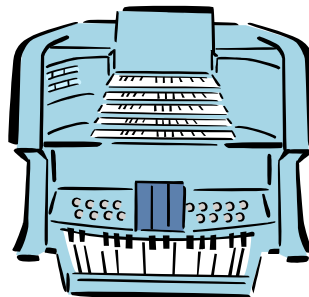

Ash Wednesday is the first day of Lent and occurs 46 days (40 days not counting Sundays before Easter. It falls on a different date each year because

it is dependent on the date of Easter. It can occur as early as February 4 (February 5 on leap years) or as late as March 10.

Ash Wednesday derives its name from the practice of placing ashes on the foreheads of adherents as a sign of repentance. The ashes used are typically gathered after the Palm Crosses from the previous year's Palm Sunday are burned. In the liturgical practice of some churches, the ashes are mixed with the Oil of the Catechumens, one of the sacred oils used to anoint those about to be baptized, though some churches use ordinary oil. This paste is used by the minister who presides at the service to make the sign of the cross, upon his or her own forehead and then on those of congregants.

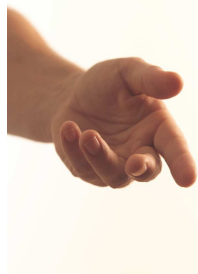

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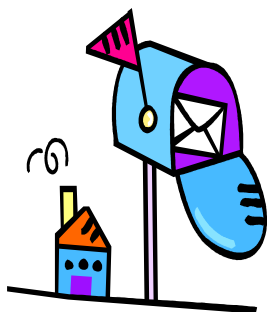
