Lent Begins on March 5 with Ash Wednesday

Lent, the 40-day period of preparation for Easter, begins with Ash Wednesday, March 5. Worship begins at 7pm with a time of prayer & reflection in the sanctuary from 6:30-6:50pm. This year our Ash Wednesday service will include the Emmaus Home Bell Choir. Also, members of Charrette Baptist Church will be joining us along with their pastor, Rev. Jack Partridge, who will be preaching that night. A light meal will be served from 5:30-6:30pm every Wednesday of Lent (help is needed for clean-up right at 6:30pm so meal preparers can participate in worship).

Then, worship each Wednesday evening at 7pm, from March 12 through April 9, will be based on the Lenten Message Series, *"40-Days of Purpose"*. Throughout this series we will explore the question, *"What on earth are YOU here for?"*. Topics such as Worship, Fellowship, Discipleship, Ministry and Evangelism will be explored each Wednesday. This series will be based on the book, *The Purpose Driven Life*, which became the bestselling hardback non-fiction book in history, and is the second most-translated book in the world, after the Bible. The author, Rick Warren wrote this book 10 years ago, as a manifesto for Christian living in the 21st century...a lifestyle based on eternal purposes, not cultural values. Using biblical stories and letting the Bible speak for itself, Warren clearly explains God's five purposes for each of us:

- We were planned for God's pleasure (so your first purpose is to offer real worship)
- We were formed for God's family (so your second purpose is to enjoy real fellowship)
- We were created to become like Christ (so your third purpose is to learn real discipleship)
- We were shaped for serving God (so your fourth purpose is to practice real ministry)
- We were made for a mission (so your fifth purpose is to live out real evangelism)

The book is written in a captivating devotional style, divided into 40 short chapters (six weeks) that can be read as a daily devotional and studied by individuals, couples, families and/or small groups. A bulk order will be placed on February 26, sign up in the lobby if you are interested.

Basics of the Christian Faith DVD Series

During March and April we will have a special Lenten Feature, "The Basics of the Christian Faith" DVD series. Topics addressed will be: "What is Christian Theology?", "Early Christian Beliefs", "The Apostle Paul's Letters", "The Gospels", "Varieties of Early Christianity", "What is the Incarnation?", "What is Grace", etc.

You are invited to come to one or all of the presentations – any that you can make. These will be presented in two sessions to accommodate the worship service you regularly attend, 9:30-10:10am (for those who typically worship at 10:30am) AND repeated at 10:35-11:15am (for those who worship at 9am). Each of the sessions will take place in the Main Fellowship Hall (Rm#106, near the front corner table) and will include a small handout, then begin with a DVD presentation on the topic by Professor Phillip Cary of Eastern University (an easy to understand, clear speaking Bible Professor). Discussion will follow. Coffee & other refreshments will be available for each session.
