## Youth Event visiting JOSEPH

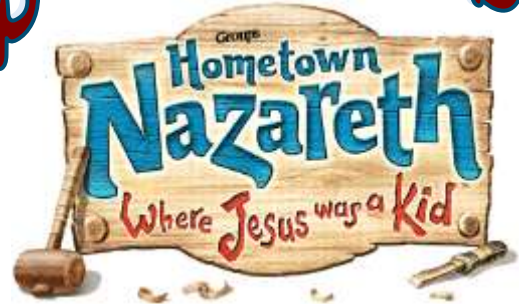

## MAY EXTRA STEP—COMPASSION INTERNATIONAL

Compassion International is at our church! As a church body, we have decided to follow Christ's command to love the poor. Compassion is a unique sponsorship program because it is church-based, and child centered. Each child has only one sponsor. We have been partnered with one specific church in the Honduras. Compassion has other programs such as "Complimentary Interventions", which does work with AIDS, malaria, provides clean water, and other needs in the community of the church. There is also a Child Survival Program which is a ministry to children and their parents from conception to age 3, providing health needs and education with the goal of helping babies and young children survive and thrive. The Leadership Development Program assists children from the Sponsorship program who have shown leadership potential to continue their education. ### When A Nation Forgets God

Adapted from an article by Erwin W. Lutzer 2010.

The quote comes from Time, 23 December, 1948 (p 38)

In Nazi Germany, the elites, who professed a love of freedom, betrayed the people. Hear the words of Albert Einstein, exiled from Germany because he was a Jew:

*Being a lover of freedom, when the (Nazi) revolution came I looked to the universities to defend it, knowing that they had always boasted of their devotion to the cause of truth; but no, the universities took refuge in silence. Then I looked to the great editors of the newspapers, whose flaming editorials in days gone by had proclaimed their love of freedom; but they, like the universities, were silenced in a few short weeks. I then addressed myself to the authors, to those who had passed themselves off as the intellectual guides of Germany, and among whom was frequently discussed the question of freedom and its place in modern life. They are, in turn, very dumb.*

*Only the Church stood squarely across the path of Hitler's campaign for suppressing the truth. I never had any special interest in the Church before, but now I feel a great affection and admiration for it because the Church alone has had the courage and persistence to stand for intellectual truth and moral freedom. I am forced to confess that what I once despised I now praise unreservedly."*
