Letter from the Pastor

For every month since the beginning of the year, except for the month of February, the church's expenses have exceeded our income. In short, as of July 31st, our income has been \$72,287.88; our expenses have totaled \$91,368.68, leaving a deficit of \$19,080.80:

However, we have made inquiries with Washington Monument Company about what kind of options that are available to make corrections to some of the stones.

For \$1,200.00, The Monument Company would send their equipment along with two employees for one day to make repairs. To get the most accomplished, we would also be looking for volunteers from the Church and Community to provide assistance to the Monument Co. Crew. If we do this, it would be done on a weekday, probably this Fall.

Anyone interested is asked to make donations to the Cemetery Board with a notation on your checks for 'Monument Repair'. This donation should not be a substitution of your regular church offering.


