Church Council Highlights:

- Exploring possible sound absorbing materials for the fellowship hall to help with sound issues: Drapes, blinds, cork, dense fabric, felt banners.
- Discussed the use of a facility reservation form and deposit to prevent double booking and assure spaces are left as found.
- The purchase of Surge Protectors (Universal Power Source Units) to protect computers, Sound System, Projection and other equipment from power surges was approved.
- Guidelines for the establishment of a Personnel Committee and its purposes were approved.
- Approved the purchase of projection system replacement receivers through Cignal Systems. Our original projection system was damaged by a power surge in May, 2013.

PRAYER MINISTRY NEWS

OCTOBER IS PASTOR APPRECIATION MONTH.

Be thinking of ways you can bless our Pastor and his family. The prayer team is planning "31 days of prayer" for them. Pastor George often says how important it is to him to know that he is being prayed for as he leads St. Paul's Church.

You will have an opportunity to participate. There will be bookmarks available for the taking, each with a number on them that will designate the day you are to pray along with some prayer points. You can take one or more. These will be "your day/s" to pray. Think of ways you can encourage him that day as well: send an email, a note, a pie....be creative.

"Brothers, pray for us." (1 Thess 5:25)

Nancy DeMoss of Revive our Hearts Ministry, in a recent article encouraged churches to honor their pastors with prayer especially during the month of October:

"Let the thought sink deep into the heart of every church that their pastor will be such a pastor as their prayers make him. . . How perilous is the condition of that pastor...whose heart is not encouraged, whose hands are not strengthened, and who is not upheld by the prayers of his people!

"It is at a fearful expense that pastors are ever allowed to enter the pulpit without being preceded, accompanied, and followed by the earnest prayers of the churches. It is no marvel that the pulpit is so powerless, and pastors so often disheartened when there are so few to hold up their hands. . . When the churches cease to pray for pastors, pastors will no longer be a blessing to the churches." Gardiner Spring (1785-1873)

There is no greater gift you can give your pastor and the spiritual leaders of your church than to pray for them. Pastors cannot win the battle alone; they need committed intercessors to lift them up in fervent, specific prayer. Imagine how the power of God might be released in our churches if we were to pray faithfully for our pastors.

Pastors are human—they face the same challenges that their people do, with some additional ones! They grow tired in ministry, are tempted to sin, and may find it difficult to balance their many roles and responsibilities. They need the encouragement and support of those they lead.

Prayer for your pastor is crucial to the spiritual health of your pastor, his family, and your church. God will reward your efforts to cover him in prayer. If you want to encourage your spiritual leaders (and their wives!) let them know you are praying for them. Ask them periodically for any specific prayer requests and assure them you will pray accordingly.

Let's join with churches around the globe in showing appreciation, honor and support for our pastor

- especially covering him and his family with our prayers!



Extra Step for October



Operation Christmas Child is our Extra Step for October. Last year was our beginning participation in this wonderful program. Operation Christmas Child is a project of Samaritan's Purse. Samaritan's Purse is a non-denominational evangelical Christian humanitarian organization that works worldwide to assist people in physical need alongside their Christian missionary work.

Operation Christmas Child gives gift-filled shoe boxes and gospel booklets to children in desperate situations around the world. Some of the children are refugees of civil war, while others are survivors of a natural disaster or victims of extreme poverty. Operation Christmas Child is often described as a simple, hands-on mission that aims to teach young people about the power of Jesus Christ.

Since each box is created by a volunteer, the contents are unique. However, the boxes often contain small toys, stuffed animals, school supplies, personal hygiene items, and hard candies. This is a fantastic outreach program to help those in need this holiday season. Let us once more touch the hearts of needy children and share the love of Jesus Christ. Last year, St. Paul's gave 102 shoe boxes filled with what one child exclaimed, "were treasures".
