A Welcoming Church

In this space last month I wrote about how *"Hospitality Wins"*, how the church is to be like a hospital in that we welcome the weary and hurting and help them discover God's hope and healing. Over the past month a prayer by Nelson Searcy, in his book Fusion, jumped off the page at me. He was writing about how in the early days of the church he leads they found themselves reaching fewer and fewer people, even though the Lord was sending first time guests to them every week. This is part of his prayer in response to the circumstances:

God, You've entrusted us with almost 80 guests over the last few months. I'm sorry for how little we've done to prepare for their coming or to follow up with them after their visit. God, I believe these are unchurched people You have trusted to our care and I've been a bad shepherd. (Fusion, p.23)

We have been focusing this year on the ways we welcome guests - your friends, neighbors and co-workers. We have added a welcome center with intentional greeters. We give out welcome packets with introductory brochures, facility maps and a recent newsletter. Why? Because if God cares enough to prompt someone to come visit us, we ought to be ready to welcome them.

In his book, Nelson tells of a time he and his wife were offered a low-rate stay at the Ritz-Carlton in DC. When they pulled into the circle drive Nelson watched as a bellman ran over, opened his door and said to his colleague, "The gentleman from North Carolina has arrived" (noticing the license plates and knowing his pre-registered guest list). The bellman next asked, "Whom are we welcoming to the Ritz-Carlton?"

They were shown to their room, called by name numerous times. Later that evening when returning from dinner, that same bellman greeted him and said, "have a good night, Mr. Searcy". The Searcy's were impressed by the guest interaction given by an organization/business whose goal it is to provide a good bed for sleep and a warm shower before departing.

How much more important is it for us, as St. Paul's Church, to welcome people whom the Lord has prompted to visit us. After all, we are in the business of introducing people to the Savior of the World and, hopefully, help them grow closer to the God who created them and equip them to live out their faith! As Author and Pastor, Andy Stanley, often says: *"The Church is a family expecting guests."*

May we continue to be a Church Family who not only expects guests or brings guests "home", but who welcomes guests extravagantly!

I have been a part of a clergy group in the Warren & Franklin Counties which is focused on building healthy communities of faith. One goal of the initiative is the forming of Mental Health teams in the local congregation to help individuals, families and church leaders adjust and adapt to mental health challenges - be they short term or long term, resulting from a crisis or due to issues relating to aging.

On Thursday, October 4, 7-8:30pm, at St. Peter's Church in Washington, there will be an introductory training session for those interested. I will be attending and encourage you, if interested in learning more, to attend with me. I am not asking for a commitment up front, but encourage you to attend one training session and see if it's something that would be of interest to you.

Here is the focus of the hour and one half training:

- mental illness in the congregation
- responding to those who struggle thru mental health teams
- training others in the congregation to be comfortable "companionship" those who mentally and emotionally struggle.
- assisting the pastor in speaking and responding to mental health issues in the congregation and community.
- joining other congregations in joint trainings.



BELTON UPDATE Back in USA, RECOVERING

Belton Summer 2012 Update

Hello from the Kenyan Coast!

Many of our family members are attempting to read through the Bible in one year. I (Dana) am using a plan (For the Love of God, Volume 1) that was designed by Robert Murray M'Cheyne and commented upon by Donald A. Carson of Trinity Evangelical Divinity School in Deerfield, Illinois. One of M'Cheyne's abiding concerns was to encourage his people, and himself, to read the Bible in parallel chapters as they sought to gain understanding.

Robert Murray M'Cheyne was born in Edinburgh on May 21, 1813. M'Cheyne died in Dundee on March 25, 1843 – not yet thirty years of age. Though so young, he was known throughout Scotland as “the saintly M'Cheyne”; and his influence embraced Scotland and all of Europe. To one young man, he wrote, “You read your Bible regularly, of course, but do try and understand it, and still more to feel it.” Pray that as a family we can understand our Bible and still more, to feel it.

I had the opportunity to preach for six weeks from the book of Exodus at Kapisha Evangelical Church in Chingola in May. I used chapters 35 through 40 of Exodus and felt we all gained a greater appreciation for the establishment of the Tabernacle and it's tools as the place designed to worship our God.

Preston Michie, Carolyn's oldest brother from Portland, and Erica Michie, Carolyn's niece, traveling back from an internship in China, came out to Zambia for a short vacation to see Victoria Falls and then to travel on to Kenya to attend Joshua's 12 grade graduation from Rift Valley Academy. They had a wonderful time in Livingstone and even crossed into Chobe National Park for one day in Botswana.

Joshua, our fourth child, graduated from Rift Valley Academy in Kijabe, Kenya on July 14.th The ceremony was very moving for all of us as we heard the choir sing, “Africa” and “Ma Yi Bu Ye” (I Shall Come Back to My Beloved Africa) in Swahili and Joshua received his diploma. Jordan and Alyssa, Benjamin and Abigail were able to attend the graduation and enjoyed playing in many of the alumni vs. varsity games.

Finally, we were all able to spend five days at Voyager Resort in Mombasa, Kenya on the Indian Ocean as a special gift to Joshua. As we watch the waves come off the ocean and listen to the wind in the palm trees at a motel that looks like paradise, we praise the Lord for the opportunity to experience this part of the world.

In just a few days, Carolyn will travel home with our children to Wisconsin to enroll Joshua at the University of Wisconsin – Oshkosh. I will travel back to Zambia to work in Chingola and we will be reunited in about six weeks in Zambia. We expect to live in Wisconsin from mid-October 2012 until July 2013. It is likely we will live in Milwaukee, Wisconsin and we look forward to visiting family/ friends/ and ministry supporters in the late fall and spring of 2013.

Please pray for all of us as we travel, return home, and minister in Wisconsin and Zambia in the next few weeks. Thank you for your commitment to our family and our ministry in Central Africa.
