## Mission Trip to Zambia

Ever wonder what it would be like to be a missionary? Have you ever felt called by God to the mission field overseas?

Our missionaries, Dana and Carolyn Belton who were here at St. Paul's earlier this year invite you to spend a month as a missionary at the local orphanage in Zambia.

**Who?** Anyone over the age of 18, or for high school students that would have a parent accompany them. All members of the team must have accepted Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior and have a desire to serve Him. Members of other churches would be welcome.

**When –** Mid May (after college is out) to Mid June 2014

**What would I do?** You would live in a hallway of the orphanage, help "your" children get ready for school; help them after school with their homework and fun play time; and help the children get ready for bed. You would also lead a VBS type study 5 days a week – the same program for three weeks, each week with different children. You would worship on the weekends at the local church as well.

You would take three days at the end of your service to visit the famous Victoria Falls, and tour Chobe National Park (think "safari").

There would also be the option to have a 2-3 layover in London on your way home.

**How much would it cost?** Money wise, it will cost about \$4000 with the hope of raising \$4400 in order to donate \$400 to the orphanage; Approximately \$2200 would need to be earned by January to purchase plane tickets, and in addition you would have to have a passport purchased by the time plane reservations are made.

Time-wise it would cost you the month that you are there, and preparation meetings once a month as well as group fund-raisers.

**Why Zambia and why next year?** Dana and Carolyn are personal contacts who will be there personally to make sure all runs smoothly and safely. Because they are only on a 2 year stay, next year would be the only time they will be there to host/coordinate the trip. They recommended this time of year because the weather is the most pleasant, and because would work out with those who are teachers or in college.

## Shannondale Mission Trip

Matthew 20:28 in the Bible reads: "Your attitude must be like my own, for I did not come to be served but to serve." That was the focus of our Mission Trip to Shannondale on June 21 thru June 23, 2013. Thirteen individuals, consisting of 7 adults and 6 youth from St Paul's Church and the community traveled to Shannon County to serve their church community. On Friday evening and Saturday morning we spent time cleaning up some overgrown campsite areas, ridding them of brush and weeds, and making them available for future campers to use. Saturday afternoon you would have found us floating on the beautiful Current River.

For those who had not experienced this float trip before, they commented on the beauty of God's Kingdom, as viewed as we slowly floated down the river. Even a brief thunderstorm did not dampen anyone's spirits. Sunday morning included a church service at Shannondale Community Church, before we traveled home. Each meal time at Shannondale included a devotional. This year we focused on Inspirational Quotes....because these words have a way of motivating us to become a better Christian. Scriptures that corresponded with Quotes from Charles Spurgeon, Randy Alcorn, Ralph Waldo Emerson, John Wesley, and Mother Theresa were studied and discussed.
