Stewardship Update. Our parishioners and attendees made our 2017 stewardship campaign a resounding success with pledges amounting to \$535,400. Please remember that your pledged amount is for calendar/tax year 2017. This represents a 13% increase in pledges from 2016 and equates to about a \$100,000 projected increase in income for 2017. The finance committee will assess the parish's financial position and recommend any changes to the Vestry. Thank you for your prayers for the campaign, thank you for prayerfully sharing your treasure, and praise God for providing for the needs of the church!

3. Collegiate Challenge Thank You!

For more than a decade, St. Simon's has served as a regional host site for Collegiate Challenge. Through this annual Habitat for Humanity event, college students are challenged to do the difficult and the unusual. They are asked to forego the customary practice of partying over spring break and, instead, commit their time to building homes for people in need.

Earlier this month, a contingent of students from Thomas More College in Kentucky arrived in the area to participate in Collegiate Challenge. These students drove 1100 miles, travelled at their own expense and spent their entire vacation week working to build a Habitat home in Crestview.

Throughout the week, the students worked competently and hard. They shingled the roof, dug trenches, and attached and painted exterior siding.

What they accomplished at the job site was truly astounding. But equally astounding was the job accomplished by the staff and parishioners back here at the host site. Your assistance and your hospitality did more than simply make the accomplishment of these students possible. It made it rewarding. It also made it enjoyable.

With one exception (a graduating senior) each of the visiting students expressed the hope that they would be invited back to Collegiate Challenge and more specifically, invited back to St. Simon's. One of their accompanying professors had this to say about the hospitality afforded by this parish: "You people are amazing. I had been here less than 45 minutes and already I was feeling at home."

Thank you to our staff members and fellow parishioners for your generous care and warm hospitality for this visiting group. Indeed, you made us shine! More so, you once again demonstrated that St. Simon's is truly what it claims to be: A beacon of God's love shining here on the Emerald Coast.

9. Stations of the Cross

WHEN? Wednesdays at 5:00 p.m. from March 8th – April 5th (5 Wednesdays)

Stations of the Cross or the Way of the Cross, also known as Way of Sorrows or Via Crucis, refers to a series of images depicting Jesus Christ on the day of his crucifixion and accompanying prayers. The stations grew out of imitations of Via Dolorosa in Jerusalem which is believed to be the actual path Jesus walked to Mount Calvary. The object of the stations is to help the Christian faithful to make a spiritual pilgrimage through contemplation of the Passion of Christ. It has become one of the most popular devotions and the stations can be found in churches of many Western Christian denominations. including Anglican, Catholic, and Western Orthodox Lutheran, Methodist, parishes.
