Student Admission Policy

New Students

Admission for new students is determined by review of the student's application package, former records, and interview with the Administrator. Academic performance and future test scores will determine continuation of enrollment. Every new student accepted will be placed on a 90 day probation pending receipt of former school records.

Returning Students

Admission for returning students is determined by review of the student's application package. If a student completed his prior year with a failing grade in any given subject, that student may be required to re-test for admission.

Kindergarten Age Requirement

Kindergarten students must be 5 years old by December 2nd. Class times are Monday through Friday, 8:15 to 3:00 pm. Children learn to master basic phonics, develop large and small motor skills, work with numbers, and more. Students also memorize bible verses weekly and are taught to apply character traits each month.

FORGIVENESS

Character First!® Education Series 1, Booklet 7



Definition

Clearing the record of those who have wronged me and not holding a grudge.



Illustration

A shepherd is responsible to care for and protect his sheep. Sheep are dependent animals and must be shown what to eat, where to drink, and where to rest. They must also be protected from predators. Many times this task is difficult because sheep are prone to wander or stray from the flock. Notice the example of the shepherd in the story as he quickly clears the record with those that have "wandered astray." Read on page 4 how the lamb also illustrates forgiveness.



Application

In life, unfortunately, being hurt or offended by someone is virtually inevitable. Thus, resolving offenses is the key to maintaining any relationship. The five "I Wills" give practical ways for anyone to demonstrate forgiveness. These statements are the basis for the songs, stories, and activities on pages 8 through 14.

I Will:

- be quick to forgive.
- not cover up my own wrongs but will be quick to ask for forgiveness.
- not seek revenge.
- respond kindly to those who hurt me.
- not take up offenses for others.



Praise

Sometimes it is hard to praise children who have disobeyed in the past. However, true forgiveness clears past wrongs and focuses on the present. If we provide correction and instruction quickly when an infraction occurs, we are then free to genuinely praise for good character. In addition, praising children for properly resolving a conflict by forgiveness will motivate them to continue forgiving others. Look for ways to praise on page 15.

Statement of Faith:

We Believe: that the Bible is the inspired, infallible, inerrant, and authoritative Word of God, and is the only standard by which a believer should conduct their life (2 Timothy 3:15-17; 2 Peter 1:21)

We Believe: that there is only one God, the creator of the heavens and the earth, Who eternally exists in three persons: the Father, Son and Holy Spirit

We Believe: that Jesus Christ (God the Son) was manifest in the flesh and was the express image of the Father (John 10:33; Phil. 2:5-8; John 14:9; Hebrews 1:3); He was born of a virgin (Isaiah 7:14; Matthew 1:23; Luke 1:34-35); He lived a sinless life (Hebrews 4:15; 7:26); His works validated His ministry as the promised Messiah (John 10:38; John 14:11); through His vicarious death and the shedding of His blood He has made atonement for the sins of the world (Ephesians 1:7; Hebrews 2:9; 1 John 2:2); He was buried and rose from the grave after three days (Matthew 16:21; John 2:19-21; 1 Corinthians 15:4); He ascended into heaven where He now sits at the right hand of the Father (Mark 16:19; Acts 1:2); He will personally return to the earth in power and great glory (Acts 1:11; Revelation 19:11-13; Revelation 19:14-16)

We Believe: that due to the sinfulness of the human nature, eternal life is only obtained by those who have been reborn by the Holy Spirit (John 3:3; Titus 3:4-5); that justification and eternal salvation, being a free gift of God's grace, is only promised to those who by faith have been cleansed by the blood of Christ and have received and confess that Jesus Christ is their personal Lord and Savior (John 3:16-19; John 5:24; Romans 5:8-9; Romans 10:9-10; Ephesians 2:8-10)

We Believe: that from the point of regeneration it is the continuous ministry of the Holy Spirit in the believers life that conforms them into the image of Christ and enables them to live a life of godliness in this present age (2 Corinthians 3:17-18; Romans 8:29; 2 Peter 1:2-4)

We Believe: that there is one Church whom Christ is the head and that as His body we are to endeavor to keep the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace (Matthew 16:18; Ephesians 1:22-23; 4:15-16; 4:1-6)

We Believe: that the Church is called to be salt and light in this present age, and it is by our love for God and for others that the world will know we are disciples of Jesus Christ (Matthew 5:13-16; John 13:34-35;)

We Believe: that both saved and unsaved will be resurrected from the grave; the saved will be resurrected unto eternal life (Literal Heaven), while the unsaved will be resurrected unto eternal damnation (Literal Hell) (John 5:28-29; Revelation 20:11-15)
