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In addition to the examples in this weeks' Capitol Update, here are a few more examples of such laws being used by one side against those that just want to live, learn, and do business according to their faith:

- Catholic Charities is forced out of the adoption business in Massachusettes for the first time in 100 years because it will not place children with homosexual couples.
- Ocean Grove Camp Ground, a Methodist camp, loses its state tax exempt status for not hosting a same-sex union in its marriage pavilion.
- Lesbian couple used Vermont's public accommodations law to file a discrimination complaint against a couple who own a small inn for expressing their concern that, as Roman Catholics, they would have a moral difficulty hosting a same-sex civil union on their premises.
- A former manager with Allstate was fired on the sole basis that he wrote a column posted on several websites that was critical of same-sex marriage and espoused Christian beliefs. This was done while he was not at work. He sued and reached a settlement.



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
