This year it was broadcast on God TV to a possible audience of some 900,000 viewers world wide, live from King of Kings Community in Jerusalem, where Tim serves as a Deacon.

When Sukkot, or the Feast of Tabernacles, Becomes Personal

For 34 years Tim has celebrated Sukkot, or the Feast of Tabernacles, in Jerusalem. But most of this time was spent behind the scenes, *in blood sweat and tears*, as the Financial Director of the International Christian Embassy Jerusalem's Christian Celebration of the Feast of Tabernacles. This celebration has now become Israel's largest tourist event on an annual basis bringing some 20 million US dollars into the Israeli economy. Every year some 4 - 6000 Christian Pilgrims come up to Jerusalem to celebrate the Feast.

This is another vision that has become a reality, and it lives on year after year, becoming the longest continuous annual Christian celebration in the World. Tim recalls how this Feast Celebration demonstrates to the Israeli people, live and in colour, that Christians really do care about Israel. Welcoming every Prime Minister since Menachem Begin at the Feast, with the exception of Ehud Barak, and to hear their reaction to the Christian outpouring of love and support for Israel and the Jewish people is a real answer to many many prayers.

Interestingly, the demographics have shifted from a Euro / American foundation, to one more from South America, Asia, and Africa. This year there were over 1000 Brazilians in attendance.

Sandro Boticelli, 1445 - 1510, an Italian Florentine painter probably never dreamed that some day his fresco, a rare masterpiece, entitled, "The Annunciation," would ever be on display in Jerusalem. But it is, and is part of a joint project by the Israel Museum and the Uffizi Gallery in Florence, Italy to commemorate Israel's 65th birthday of the Modern State.

As a matter of interest, it was another Boticelli painting entitled, *Primavera*, that young Anna King selected as a poster when we visited the Uffizi Museum during a Church trip hosted by Denny and Maureen Hurst. Good taste, Anna. The poster hung in her room for many years.

How appropriate that "The Annunciation" could now be a witness to the life and ministry of Jesus in Jerusalem.


