

Pastor's Column

On October 30th, we will kick off the larger Fall Festival celebration with a Blessing of the Pets at 4:30 P.M.

I have never had a pet that I didn't love. Even the honeybees in the hive in my back yard arouse my affection. I protect them and watch over them. I appreciate the vital work they do pollinating flowers and making honey.

The fondness I have for my bees is, of course, nothing compared to the way Ann and I love our dog, Pippa. Pippa inspires love and demonstrates it. There's something special about her tail-wagging welcome when we come home. The goodness of God's creation is reflected in her bright little eyes.

Love figures heavily in the Blessing of the Pets. In 1 John, we read that God is love. It is easy to recognize that there is something sacred in every relationship. Chief among these sacred connections is God's love for the human creation, made evident in the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus. Jesus died in response to human sin, and was raised in victory over that sin. This act of divine love is so expansive that it contains every act of love an all love. Whatever we do for the animals around us and whatever they do for us is a reflection of God's superior love.

So we take time to bless our pets. We understand that our relationships with our sweet dogs and clever cats, our beautiful birds and magnificent horses, our bright fish and wonderful small animals are all relationships that further God's loving way in the world. "God is love, and those who abide in love abide in God, and God abides in them." (I John 4:16)

Bring your pet on October 30th. If it is not practical to bring your animal companion, bring a picture. If the date is inconvenient, know that I am willing to make house calls to bless your pet.

The Blessing of the Pets is hardly the most important thing we do all year. That would probably be Easter services. But the Blessing of the Pets is a way to show God's love in the world. We're all for that.

Great Advent activities for children also.



Very far! On October 30 we have an opportunity to see just how much impact 3 Cents a Meal can make! During worship that Sunday, our children will be coming around the sanctuary to collect your gifts for 3 Cents a Meal. If each person gives the equivalent of that for this year, it will be \$27.00 (\$.3 per meal x 3 meals per day x 30 days x 10 months).

Imagine the impact - 1/3 will go to our Food Pantry, 2/3 to the Presbyterian Hunger Program. \$9 of that \$27 will go to help hungry people who walk through our doors, \$18 to help hungry people in the wider community and the world. Together we will make a huge impact. Bring your change, your bills, your checks and be ready to help our children gather it on October 30! (We will be collecting 3 Cents a Meal in worship on every 5th Sunday.)

POPS will meet on Tuesday October 11, 9:15am in the Parlor. Our brief time together is a space apart, for support, nurture and fellowship. All who have a preschool age child are welcome-child care provided for children not in preschool that morning and infants are welcome to join the group. Invite a friend who has young children - this is a group that is open to the community!





Plan now to join us on Sunday October 30, 5:00-6:00pm in Fellowship Hall. This will coincide with our Blessing of The Pets, which will begin at 4:30 in the courtyard. Both pets and kids can wear costumes! Our Youth are planning a fun event for preschool and elementary children - games, snacks, and more! Wear your costume and enjoy a time of fun and fellowship. Invite your neighbors also.

Game Night Returns! Friday October 28, beginning around 6pm in Fellowship Hall. Bring a finger food (or other simple) appetizer to share and any games you want to play. We'll have lots to choose from and someone to teach as needed. Great for all ages. Come when you can, leave when you must! Questions? See Leslee or Glenn Kirkconnell.





Sunday Mornings

Find your place on Sunday mornings! We have classes for all ages and nursery care for our youngest members. Fellowship and coffee are available beginning at 8:30am in Fellowship Hall. Children have choir from 9-9:30am and Sunday morning education begins at 9:30am.

Adults have three options - the **Ellis Class**, meeting in room 201, using the Present Word (Uniform Lesson Series); the **Christian Thought Class**, meeting in the Conference Room. They are finishing their DVD series on the Protestant Reformation. Following that the Rev. Dr. Matthew Covington will begin a series on the 'new' Catechism as a way to learn and discuss Reformed Theology. The **Coffee & Conversation Class**, meeting in room 203, uses each week's preaching scripture to consider how it impacts them, through the Lambeth Bible Study method. And of course good fellowship and conversation happens in all our classes!

Come for one, stay for both! On Sunday October 30, beginning at 4:30pm we will have our **Blessing of The Pets.** Bring your furry, finned or feathered friend for a special blessing. If you pet can't make it, bring a picture. This will coincide with our Fall Festival for children -so both pets and children can wear their costumes!

Session Report

The Session met for its regular meeting on September 20, 2016 in the Church conference room.

These items highlighted the meeting:


College Ministry

You are invited to become a member of our Presbyterian Women organization by becoming a member of one of our circles. These circles are actually groups of women who become friends and a true support system for each other. Most meet once a month to study and discuss various Bible study interests. We are a part of the national organization through the Western Kentucky Presbytery, Synod of Living Waters and General Assembly.

What We Do:

Three national and international offerings that we support include the Thank Offering begun in 1888; the Birthday Offering begun in 1922; and the Fellowship of the Least Coin begun in the 1940's. Through these offerings, we help meet the needs of hurting people: the aging, disabled, homeless, refugees, children, youth and women, through educational, health, and peace and justice programs. We empower through our offerings new and existing projects around the world to expand their work in new and creative ways. HYGIENE KITS

- 1 hand towel (approximately 16"x28", (no fingertip or bath towels)
- 1 washcloth
- 1 wide tooth comb (remove from package)
- 1 nail clipper (no metal files or emery boards; remove from package)
- 1 bar of soap (in original package)
- 1 toothbrush (in original package)
- 10 band-aids or other adhesive bandage strips

Please do not add toothpaste to the hygiene kit. Toothpaste that has an extended expiration date will be added to international hygiene kit shipments just prior to shipment. Seal all items in a one-gallon plastic bag with zipper closure.
