- 1) Sketch of lot with all utility, pools, ponds, and all well locations.
- 2) Application shall be filled out completely and applicant/owner must be able to substantiate all data given.
- 3) This application will not be processed unless accompanied by the required fee.
- 4) A permit will not be granted unless the sewage disposal system installation can conform with the rules of the Toledo- Lucas County Board of Health and Ohio Department of Health governing such installations.
- 5) This application expires (1) one year from date of application.
- 6) Permit refund policy: it is the policy of the Toledo-Lucas County Health Department to not refund fees for permit or licenses once plans have been received, a site inspection has been made, or when work towards a permit or license has been attempted by this agency. If special circumstances present themselves the Health Commissioner or his representative may waiver this policy. Permit is not transferable.

OVER

I/We understand that the soils at _____ are rated by Ohio Department Natural Resources as severe due to high water table, slow permeability, seasonal wetness and/or extended periods of ponding following heavy rains. The wetness hazard, slow or very slow permeability, and/or a high rate of shrinking and swelling severely limit the soil for many non-farm uses, including on lot sewage systems. There is a high rate of failure on on-lot sewage systems due to these factors. I/We understand that the issuance of a permit to install does not constitute expressed nor implied approval nor assurance that a sewage system installed in this soil will operate in satisfactory manner. It is further understood that the following restrictions apply.

- 1) The tile field shall not be constructed during periods when the ground is frozen nor when the moisture content will cause smearing of the trench walls and/or trench bottoms.
- 2) Roof drains; foundation drains and other clear water connections to the disposal system are prohibited.
- 3) Soils may not be compacted in the area where the leach field is to be installed. The use or parking of heavy machinery or vehicles in this area is prohibited.
- 4) Perimeter tiles may be required on all installations where appropriate drainage exists or can be arranged.
- 5) The use of non-approved fill dirt in the area of the leach field is prohibited. All fill dirt used in the area of the leach field, even if fill is not required, must be approved by this office.
- 6) Once the system has been inspected and approved, it must be promptly back filled, graded and seeded.
- 7) Sufficient area for the relocation and replacement of the leach field must be maintained on the property.
- 8) Soil conditions may require restriction water usage. The owner is responsible for providing and maintaining an approved working sewage system.

I/We understand the violation of any of the aforementioned restrictions or other household sewage disposal rules could result in the Toledo-Lucas County Health Department disapproving the on lot sewage system as installed. New homes may not be occupied if the sewage system is disapproved. The Toledo-Lucas County Health Department reserves the right to order any steps necessary for the correction of the problem, including the replacement of all inappropriate fill dirt.
