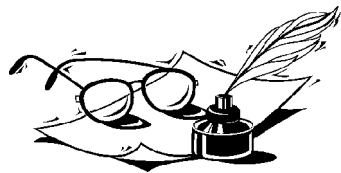

Greetings,

I hope that you have had the chance to join us for our summer worship and Trinity Café. We have had a fantastic time together, so if you have not yet checked out what is happening at Trinity on Sundays this summer, stop by. Worship at 9 am with Trinity Café, a time for brunch/fellowship/ bible study, following. We are now using the NOOMA DVD's during the Café time.



I want to give you a brief look into the weekend I spent in Covington, KY at Synod Assembly. It was nothing short of a positive, uplifting experience. Bishop Mark Hansen, the presiding Bishop of the ELCA, joined us and shared with us a vi-

sion of the church that was full of hope. He also led us in the election process of a new Bishop of the IK Synod, with the assembly electing Rev. Bill Gafkjen. We also celebrated with Bishop Jim Stuck as he retires from being our Bishop for the past 12 years.

A resolution was adopted for our Synod- congregations and families- to support the current Lutheran Malaria initiative. The Lutheran Malaria Initiative "is an unprecedented collaborative effort among the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, The Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod and Lutheran World Relief to mobilize the nearly 8 million Lutherans in the United States to join the battle against malaria -- a preventable and treatable disease that kills more than one million people a year" (www.elca.org). It was an uplifting weekend reminding me that the church is indeed at work in the community and world engaging in the Gospel of Christ. Let us together continue in this mission!

Bishop-Elect Rev. William O. Gafkjen

The Rev. William O. "Bill" Gafkjen (GUFF-ee-ehn) was elected June 5 to a six-year term as bishop of the Indiana-Kentucky Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) at the synod assembly in Covington, Ky.

Gafkjen, 52, assistant to the bishop of the Indiana-Kentucky Synod, was elected on the fifth ballot for bishop with 301 votes to 168 votes for the Rev. Steven L. Schwier, Christ the King Lutheran Church, South Bend, Ind. The Rev. Michael R. Brown, Risen Lord Lutheran Church, Bargersville, Ind., was also a nominee on the fourth ballot for bishop. There were 56 names on the first or nominating ballot. Gafkjen led on all ballots.

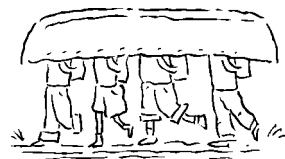

Traveling Light by Max Lucado takes you on a verse by verse journey through the 23rd Psalm. Many think of it as the funeral psalm. One used to bless the deceased as they join God in a new home. However, it is very much about life & living.

Lucado focuses on how the psalm can help you release burdens you've been carrying. So many people are traveling through life completely bogged down with the weight of worries, guilt, shame, arrogance, weariness, envy, fear, grief, loneliness & the list could go on. Psalm 23 can help us see how God is there & *wants* to carry those burdens for us. The same baggage that we drag around, stressing our minds & bodies to the point of breaking is so easy for Him to handle. We simply have to ask Him to & hand it over.

It is a quick read with inspirational & personal stories. A study guide is in the back if you would like to delve deeper or use it in a Bible study. Discover the promises found in the 23rd Psalm & begin traveling lighter!

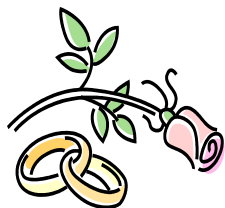
