

### **BACK & FORTH**

Always at this time of the year we are drawn to take a look back and prepare to go forth into a new year. The last two months of the year are busy with closing out and documenting the happenings of the year and planning/forecasting expected goals and events for the

New Year. The following is a recap of the "Back" and a looking "Forth" at Trinity's ongoing ministry.

### **BACK**

Reflecting on the year 2009 at Trinity many exciting events and ministries were begun or have grown. During a year of unparalleled financial hardship for many, the Trinity family continued to provide financial support and even dug a little deeper when the sanctuary remodel costs exceeded initial cost estimates. The Sunday worship attendance has increased throughout the year with increased numbers at both the 9am and the 10:30am services. An anticipated drop-off of attendance once the remodel project began has not materialized. Actually the highest attendance figures have been realized during the last couple of months.

The Trinity Kids Club (Afternoon Program) has continued to offer daily meals and after school recreation and study venues for an average of 25 students per day. A number of the attendees have made Trinity their home away from home becoming active in the senior and junior high Youth Ministries and participation in the weekly confirmation classes. Last summer a total of 30 youth were able to experience an exciting fun and faith based week of summer camp at Camp Oakhurst.

The Food Distribution Ministry has grown exponentially over the year as a result of the economic downturn in the community. The efforts of a devoted volunteer staff has provided food staples to an average of 200 families every month. Over 400 boxes of food were distributed at the December Distribution day. This ministry has far exceeded its physical and financial resources through the frugal oversight of expenses and the efforts of many to make use of limited physical resources.

Funding from the Mission Endowment Fund, the SaveMart S.H.A.R.E.S. card income, and the generosity of the Trinity family have made this ministry possible.

Throughout the year Trinity has hosted a number of outside groups using our facilities for worship, meetings, and special events. These groups consisted of FUSD, Fresno Metro Ministries, Cuerpo Evangelico Cristiano Church, Norden Lodge, Scottish Society of Central California, AA, NAMI, Warming of Fresno Afghan Group among others.

Trinity has teamed up with Every Neighborhood Partnership (ENP) this past year. The first project was to paint a home for a nearby neighbor. It was a very successful first venture with Trinity's efforts being recognized for the amount of youth involved and is being used by the ENP as a model for others.

Final design plans were completed, project funding requirements solidified with congregational support received during the last quarter of the year. The remodel project was begun at the beginning of November with an expected four (4) month project timeline. Thanks again to a volunteer crew who diligently cleaned out rooms and storage areas and painted and repaired areas that eventually were used to accommodate the relocation of materials from the sanctuary and the facilitating of worship services.

Many thanks go out to Lynne Pedersen and Ed Brewer whose terms of service on Church Council have ended. We thank Lynne for her years of dedicated service as Treasurer and Ed for his valued leadership and input on all Council decision making matters. We know that all God's children got shoes . . . but some are just a little bigger than others. Thanks to both of you for sharing of your gifts.

### **FORTH**

Number one on the horizon is anticipated completion of the Trinity Sanctuary Remodel project. Every effort will be made to keep the project on track with a goal of holding Easter services in the newly remodeled/ renovated Sanctuary. We'll have a brand new Sanctuary – God's home. Let's all work together to make sure it's full. The Trinity Kids Club will continue to serve the local neighborhood youth. Financial resources will be explored to provide the funds to maintain and expand the program to meet the demands.

Trinity's new website will launch on or about January 1, 2010. The website will give our web presence a fresh look that is attractive and appealing as well as a good representation of who we are. The new site gives us many more options to offer resources to our members. The new website technology provides the capability to process online giving, to podcast Pastor Rob's sermons with a built-in audio player, to take online surveys, and to monitor all the traffic to Trinity's website and the particular pages of interest. The new technology affords a very user friendly environment for editing and updating of information on the site. With this new format, the management of the website can be now be performed by Church office staff. Thanks go to Joetta Engelman for her many years of dedicated service to maintaining Trinity's current website and for setting the standard of excellence required as we move forward.

Our association with Every Neighborhood Partnership (ENP) will expand in the new year in ways that are not yet known to us. In the plans are doing a smoke detector installation day in the local neighborhood where batteries will be changed for existing detectors and new detectors installed where none exist. Current efforts are underway pursuing partnership opportunities with Centennial Elementary school that will include classroom volunteers, campus beautification projects, and sports clinics.

The Food Distribution Ministry will continue to do a monthly food give away on the third Saturday of the month. Ways to improve the efficiency are always a priority and will continue throughout the year. Continued support for the program will be sought both financially and through a dedicated group of volunteers.
