### **Be Transformed**

Tobin Crenshaw writes: "Monarch butterflies follow a very specific generational migration. Starting in Mexico, the first generation will fly to the southern United States where they will remain for life. Their offspring will fly to the central



states, stopping somewhere around the Ohio River, where they will reproduce. At this point the third generation will migrate to Canada to lay eggs. The fourth generation that is born in Canada will then take a miraculous flight all the way back to the same mountains in Mexico where their great grandparents originated from.

For countless years this incredible butterfly has been following this same four generation cycle, one of the most incredible yet mysterious journeys in the natural world. In short, they do it because it is in their nature.



For the first four months of this fiscal year (July 1 through Oct 31), Trinity's financial results have been running slightly better than the budget passed at our Voters' Meeting in June. Details are as follows:

- Church Weekly Offerings of \$269,000 were equal to budget.
- Academy Tuition and Fees of \$701,000 were 4% higher than budget due to strong enrollment in our Trailblazers program this last summer.
- Total Revenue of \$970,000 was 3% better than budget.
- Total Expenses of \$957,000 were 5% below budget due to lower than expected salaries and benefits for our Church staff due to the vacant Associate Pastor and Communications Director positions.
- The bottom-line netted to a very slight surplus of \$13,000 versus the expected loss for these four months.

As indicated at our June Voters' Meeting, the Board is looking at every opportunity to improve the compensation of our employees who work so hard to provide support, or direct the many ministries of Trinity. Our first step was to address the rising cost of healthcare insurance for our employees. Starting this month, the Church will increase its contribution to insurance premiums by roughly \$50/month/employee. Thus, the church will not only absorb the increase for 2018 but will actually reduce employees' monthly premiums versus 2017, thereby increasing their take-home pay.

At our December Board meeting, we will consider other possible actions to raise compensation across Trinity. It would help if our revenue (Offerings and Tuition) were running significantly above budget. However, as previously mentioned, we are only slightly ahead of budget through October, which limits our options. We love and value our Trinity employees; and we know that in this healthy job market they may be lured by other, more lucrative choices. As 2017 comes to a close, we hope that you will join us in supporting our Christmas Caring program so that these ministries can remain well funded in 2018.

### **Operation Christmas Child Update**

### Thanks for your generosity!

Tens of thousands of U.S. families were on a mission to make an impact in the lives of children in need. They donated colorfully wrapped shoebox gifts that were sent to children around the world—many of whom have never received a gift before, and have very little to call their own.

November 13–20 was Operation Christmas Child's National Collection Week. Caring people around the country collected shoebox gifts filled with fun toys, school supplies, and hygiene items. The Samaritan's Purse project will deliver these gifts to children affected by war, disease, disaster, poverty and famine. A global movement began across the United

States and seven other sending countries, millions focused on making a difference in the lives of children facing difficult circumstances.

"What a joy to be a part of something bigger than ourselves like Operation Christmas Child. Giving such simple gifts like those found in shoeboxes mean the world to children with great need, and it's something we can all do," said Operation Christmas Child Senior Domestic Director, Randy Riddle.

More than 100,000 volunteers that included families, churches, and other groups, joined forces this year to contribute to the largest Christmas project of its kind. Operation Christmas Child hopes to collect enough shoebox gifts from the 2017 campaign, to reach 12 million children, with 9.6 million coming from the United States.
