I know this never happens to your kids, but when my kids were little, occasionally they'd get into little arguments that seem petty to me, but major to them. "He



took my cookie!"
"She wrote on my
paper!" "They won't
let me play!" Like a
dutiful parent, I'd
step in, find the
culprit and insist that
child apologize for the
offense. Reluctantly,
the offender would
furrow the brow,
cross the arms and
snort, "I'm sorry!"

Sadly, many of us are like that. We sin against God and his loving boundaries on our lives. Because we tend to want to live life on our own terms, when we are confronted with the offense — either through scripture or the loving correction of another — we buckle down and begrudgingly say to God, "I'm sorry!"

Right now we are in the season of Lent. It is a time to willingly and humbly remember that we are sinful. As our beautiful Lutheran liturgy says, "We have sinned against (Him) in thought, word and deed" which reminds us to confess sin in light of the cross and receive forgiveness in light of the empty tomb.

Reflection and correction are good. Restoration and redemption are great! During this time of thought and prayer, may God bring you to a place where your "I'm sorry" leads to hearing and experiencing the words from God: "I forgive you in Jesus."

Volunteer Testimony

I received a call from Jack Jorgenson back in late November telling me that one of the eighth grade boys' groups was losing a leader. I was asked to consider stepping in. Several days of considering it turned into a week of considering it, and not committing quite yet.

I had started coaching the girls basketball team at Trinity Academy a few years ago, after being encouraged by my daughter. At that time I hadn't really known much about basketball, but as it turned out, basketball was only a small



part of what coaching preteen girls was about. I am currently coaching the team again, and once again I find that listening, patience, perseverance, and communication are what's really important. Feeling frustrated after a practice where everyone gets distracted, and then being overwhelmed with pride when they rally and play well a few days later, is an emotional roller coaster. I wasn't sure I had the religious knowledge to lead this group that Jack was asking about, but I felt in my heart that just like basketball, it was going to be the other things that would prove to be important.

I have now spent eight Wednesday nights with a group of 8th grade boys who have grown to trust me, and who are opening up and sharing their faith, fears, questions, and hearts with me. I confess that I am sometimes rushing to read up before I have to lead, or sometimes even shoot from the hip when it comes to the study preparation, but I am finding that sharing my experiences seem to be something they are relating to. I lost my father as a child and we struggled as a result, but I always knew love from my family, and I always had faith in God. It turns out that all I needed to make a connection with this group of boys was the willingness to share my stories and to hear theirs. I am lifted up every Wednesday watching youth use their gifts on stage to lead worship, hearing a nervous teen give a testimony, or watching my own group lead and share what prayer means to them. Like the basketball team, they joke around and get distracted and it can be frustrating, but then you see those moments where they are growing in their faith and it is all worth it. I am proof that whether it is boys or girls, basketball or religion, you don't have to be an expert to make a difference in a teen's life. Submitted by Jeff Gibson



TRINITY QUILTERS

The Trinity Quilters first met in the fall of 2002 when it was suggested that graduating seniors receive a quilt as a gift from our church family. That first year seven of us, all working full time jobs, met a few evenings a month and made 40 quilts! On Mother's Day, the students selected quilts of their choice. Currently, graduating seniors are given the opportunity to request a graduation quilt and indicate their color and topic choices. The quilts are displayed in the downtown chapel on Mother's Day. These are given as a gift on "Senior Recognition Sunday" in May.

The Trinity Quilters make 20 quilts each year as Christmas gifts for the children at Grace Place in New Richmond. Quilts for children are also donated to Turningpoint in River Falls. At least one quilt is donated to the Trinity Academy Gala. "Little Dresses and Britches" are sewn for Jacob Oreso and others to take on foreign mission trips. Our newest project is the creation of "fidget quilts" to be used by folks with dementia, Parkinson's Disease, or other sensory disorders.

The Trinity Quilters has grown to about 25 people. We pride ourselves on having few rules. Some quilt only at home, others quilt when we meet as a group. Some members make blocks for others to assemble, while others take delight in completing the entire process. All of us enjoy learning new techniques and visiting with each other. 


Faith Development Plans

On April 10th more than 40 Trinity students will be proclaiming their faith in Christ, in the presence of family and friends, during our Confirmation service. They will need prayer and guidance on the next steps of growth in relationship with their Savior, a lifelong process. To help them be more intentional, each student has been required to write and submit a personal faith development plan. The goal: for students to become aware of the things in their lives that help them achieve full potential in Christ, allowing each to become who He has called them to be while seeking the will of our Heavenly Father. The plan requires:


- 1. Five key verses or passages in the Bible that reflect who God is in their life
- 2. A brief description of passions, things they naturally enjoy doing, that God has laid on their hearts, then an explanation of how they will use them for God's glory
- 3. Development of a personal list of disciplines that will help them grow in spiritual maturity such as prayer, Scripture reading, meditation, fellowship with other believers, or service; Students then briefly describe how they will apply these in the next 12 months.



- B. Identification of people in their lives that are trusted friends/peers willing to hold them accountable to their faith proclamation
- C. Identification of people in their lives they will plan to encourage and share their faith relationship with

How does one confess and ask forgiveness of sins? Does a pastor need to be present in order for God to listen?

If one is truly regretful of their sin and wants forgiveness, they simply need to pray and ask. The assurance is from 1 John that says if we confess our sin, God is faithful and will forgive our sin because of Jesus.

At any point, you can even say your confession privately and confidentially to a pastor. Then you can hear of the great forgiveness you have and receive encouragement, but having a pastor present isn't necessary to be forgiven from God.

The World Race Mission Trip

My name is Kelsey Robertson and I live in Hudson with my family. I work at Trinity Family Center Childcare and I love it! Faith and travel are huge parts of my life and I have found an amazing way to combine my biggest passions! I have been accepted to The World Race mission trip through *Adventures in Missions*. The World Race is a mission program that sends me and about 50 others to 11 different countries over the course of 11 months, spending one month in each country. I will go to three countries in Africa, including Ghana, four in Asia, including India and Nepal, and lastly Central America, ending my experience in Belize. I am extremely excited that God has called me to do mission work around the world.



Through The World Race, my team and I will serve in partnership with churches and ministries in local communities to preach the Gospel, plant churches, work in orphanages, minister to women and children trapped in prostitution as a result of human trafficking, and above all, bring the restorative hope of the Father's love to many tribes and nations. I will face many challenges throughout this time, but as I prepare for my departure, one of the greatest challenges is financial support.
