A Long Time Ago

500 years is a long time. Changes in our world have gone from minor to severe - from small to epic. Think about the developments in transportation, technology, morality, and lifestyle.

Yet, while the external world morphed and evolved into where we are today, people are still the same. Like people back then, we all desire happiness and we all avoid pain. We all want to be loved, and we all want to know we have a God-given purpose.

500 years ago, the Roman Catholic Church had deviated so far from its Biblical mourning in who people are in the sight of God, that they believed God required them to meet an impossible standard in order for Him to love them. For example, the church required folks to pay money -- for themselves and relatives -- to be released from the 'holding pen' of their sin.



In steps Martin Luther, who in 1517, nailed 95 statements to the church door in Wittenberg in order to begin a dialogue that he hoped would help bring the Church back on course. His premise? We are saved by grace through faith in Jesus. It is not by works that we gain God's favor, but solely on His mercy experience in and through Jesus Christ. (From Ephesians and Romans)

October marks the 500th year anniversary of this re-declaration and the beginning of the reformation. We praise God for His incredible gift of mercy, and that there is nothing that can separate us from God's love in Christ!

Summer Adventures

Lorain Mission Trip

Summer 2016 was an incredible time for Trinity youth ministry at The Cross. Students experienced Wild Mountain Water Park, Go Karts, and Alpine Slides. A group traveled to Louisiana to join thousands of others in the LCMS National Youth Gathering. Families attended the Annual SonShine Music Festival in Somerset to hear incredible bands like Switchfoot, Family Force Five, and Rend Collective. Youth of The Cross even got in several rounds of Paint Ball in River Falls, and explored the Compassion Experience in Afton.

Another group went on mission to serve the Ohio community of Lorain, detouring in Kentucky along the way, to visit the Creation Museum. This Ohio Mission Trip brought 7 adults and 11 middle and high school students to serve the residents of Lorain, a small town along the southern shore, on the west end of Lake Erie. We worked along side a group from Richmond Virginia, under the exceptional guidance of the 19-23 year old young adults who run a mission program called Next Step Ministries. Much of this experience was highlighted during our extended, student-run church service on September 18th. *The pictures below and on page 2 are from the mission trip.*

While in the vans on the way home, our students were asked to reflect on what they had learned and experienced: serving, submission to the needs of others, Creation Museum experience, how they grew closer to God, and what change they would bring home with them. A few of the responses students provided are shared here. Any one of them would love to tell you their personal story if asked!

Connor "This experience will carry into my home life in the way I treat people. I think that I will be more patient with others. I think that I will also serve others more often. I truly hope that I will continue to seek God after I get home.

Elizabeth "I felt God working through me this week by showing me how to love better. I felt him opening my heart to love people I didn't know. He taught me that even though I was helping strangers, I am no better than them. I am called to love them and serve them without expecting anything in return."

Nate "This year was great! We got to go to the Creation Museum, learning about things that go on in the world and if there even is a God. The Creation Museum made me want to read more about God. We also got to enjoy the beautiful Lake Erie sunsets. I would encourage someone to go on a mission trip not only to serve God's people, but to learn more about Him."

Hannah "People should go because you get to form a strong bond with others that nobody else could understand. Also you get to feel God working through you by helping other people."

Kolton "I went on this mission trip because it would be good for me to show others how I could give up my electronics and serve people to represent my church and the Lord."

Frances "Go because it is a lot of fun and you bring joy to others. You make their lives easier and they have a better home to come back to. The Creation Museum was amazing."

Kim Gallison "I witnessed so much compassion and dedication this week. I constantly saw kids (and adults as well) placing themselves "3rd", acting on the needs of others. My prayer is that we carry this fellowship and willingness to serve back to Hudson with us. I pray this light of Christ shines through us in all we do. Praise be to God!


the day as a part of your quiet time or as you're hustling along in your day. Some days you may send up a quick prayer and some days you may be led to look up the scriptures and spend time with God, praying over our pastors and the congregation. Praying for these leader-servants is an act of service and a wonderful way to bless our church. Pastors have a great responsibility and are often the target of criticism, fatigue, discouragement, and attacks of the enemy. It is a worthy task to take up the responsibility of prayer for them.

FOUNDATIONAL FAITH

500 Years

Martin Luther was eight years old when Christopher Columbus set sail from Europe and landed in the Western Hemisphere. Luther was a young monk and priest when Michelangelo was painting the Sistine Chapel in Rome. A few years later, he was a junior faculty member at a new university in small-town Germany, intently studying the Scriptures, "captivated with an extraordinary ardor for understanding Paul in the Epistle to the Romans."

In those days Luther was tormented by the demand for righteousness before God. "I did not love, yes, I hated the righteous God who punishes sinners, and secretly, if not blasphemously, certainly murmuring greatly, I was angry with God." Then, in the midst of that struggle with God, the message of the Scriptures became clear, like a long-shut door opening wide. When he realized that a "merciful God justifies us by faith, I felt that I was altogether born again and had entered paradise itself through open gates."



What Luther discovered is the freedom of Christians trusting God's mercy in Christ. As he later wrote, "Faith is God's work in us. It changes us and makes us to be born anew of God. This faith is a living, busy, active, mighty thing. It is impossible for it not to be doing good works incessantly. Faith is a living, daring confidence in God's grace, so sure and certain that believers would stake their lives on it a thousand times."

The reformation that took place in Martin Luther's heart burst into a flame on October 31, 1517, and spread through the world as many others were struggling to find the same confidence and freedom. On that day, he posted a series of 95 theses or propositions for debate and discussion in the university where he taught. That document was printed on a new-fangled technology device (Gutenberg's printing press) and distributed throughout Germany and the rest of Europe.

October 31, 2016 marks the beginning of the 500th year of the Reformation. Throughout this year there will be many events and opportunities for celebrating and recapturing the essence of the Gospel that was at the heart of the Reformation. On Sunday, October 29, 2017 there will be a special festival worship service at Concordia University in St. Paul. The university is also sponsoring a special exhibit in 2017 and putting on a Tony-award winning play on the life and times of Luther. PBS will be airing a documentary in 2017 entitled "Martin Luther: An Idea that Changed the World."

I read a poignant editorial from The Washington Post recently. The writer said that Mother Theresa is to be recognized as a saint by the Catholic Church – she will be called St. Theresa of Calcutta. Not many of us would consider poverty a virtue, but Mother Theresa lived it as such. Like the Lord Jesus, she owned little except the clothes on her back. Ministering to the poor, she eschewed worldly goods; she literally had no desire to acquire *things*. The article went on to detail how, instead, she provided for and LOVED those in need.

While I don't think most of us are called to do what she did, as Christ-followers, we can and should live a life of poverty of sorts – the kind that loves our brother and sister more than our worldly goods. The kind of life that outright rejects materialism and the corruption that is consumerism, and instead, uses the things God has given us to shower love on our neighbors as ourselves. Poverty has two intertwining facets: deep physical need and an even deeper need for love. Providing one without the other, and we'll just have programs. (The government has those aplenty.) Mother Theresa did both. Jesus did too.

Trinity has many opportunities for you to love people and provide for their physical needs. Are you doing what you can in this area? Follow the examples of Jesus and Mother Theresa and join with Trinity to help. Contact any of the church staff, Board of Directors, or our committees to see how you might serve. Also, consider increasing your giving to the church to support our ministries to the needy.

Board of Directors

Trinity finished its 2016 fiscal year in relatively strong shape. Here is the final recap:

- Church general offerings of \$979,000 were \$39,000 or 4% above budget
- ⇒ Academy & Early Childhood revenue of \$2.27 million was \$67,000 or 3% above budget
- **⊃** Expenses of \$3.03 million were \$9,000 or less than 1% above budget
- Net of \$218,000 not only covered our 1st mortgage principal payments of \$127,000 but also allowed us to build up some cash cushion that we have lacked for several years.

We thank God who has blessed us with a strong Church! We thank our members who generously support the ministries of Trinity through their offerings! We thank the many parents who entrust their children's education to us at Trinity Academy and Trinity Early Childhood Academy! Last but not least, we thank our fantastic staff who work so hard, and often wear many hats to get the job done as economically as possible!



Our stronger financial position has enabled us to address unexpected equipment failures the last few months, including replacement of a riding lawn mower and a water heater. We are now evaluating whether to start a Capital Improvement Fund. Such a "rainy day" fund would make it easier for us to handle the inevitable equipment and building failures that come with the wonderful facilities with which God has blessed us.

Also, please know that we are already applying your generous offerings to the Unleashed Debt Reduction Drive to pre-pay our 2nd mortgage - more than \$65,000 has been paid down in the first few months of the drive!

Please plan to attend the Congregational Assembly at noon on Sunday, October 23rd in the Downtown Sanctuary. We will elect new members to our Board of Directors and Nominations Committee. Plus, Pastor Todd Stocker and Congregation President Steve Hamill, will lead continued discussion of Trinity's vision and mission. We greatly value your participation and input.

Pastoral Call Committee Update

In the summer of 2017, Pastor Tim will be retiring. As such, we have formed a call committee to seek God's next shepherd here at Trinity to serve alongside Pastor Todd.

Over the past few months, the committee has developed a timeline, started interviews with staff, polled the congregation, and held forums — all in an effort to get as much input as they can toward developing a ministry description for the new pastor.

The next steps in the process include gathering names from the District and congregation, reviewing the candidate's personal information, and setting up phone interviews to determine which candidates we'll bring in for on-site interviews in February/March.
