
Patty Swirczek presented the revised and complete 2014 budget of \$707,000 for Council discussion and approval. Patty reported the 2012 audit is complete.




- **Video Seminar with Experts**

## TRINITY OPPORTUNITY - BILLY CZAPLA INTERNSHIP

At the upcoming Trinity Annual Congregational Meeting on Sunday, February 2, Trinity members will have the opportunity to vote on the approval of Billy Czapla joining the staff as a seminary intern. Many of you know Billy and Denise Czapla and their daughter Camille who regularly attend Worship Services at Trinity. Billy and Denise designed and lead the "Wired 12-2" Junior High Ministry, and Billy serves on the Trinity Property Committee as well. In recent years God has confirmed in Billy's heart a Call to Pastoral Ministry. In December of 2013 he began a course of study via distant learning with Niagara Lutheran Theological Institute to complete a Master of Divinity Equivalency that would qualify him to serve as a pastor in our national church association, Lutheran Congregations in Mission for Christ (LCMC).

for service as an ordained minister. The expectation is that, upon his graduation, Billy would seek a Call to an LCMC Church.

Of course, Trinity too will benefit with the addition of a gifted leader to our staff. His internship would be part time throughout the two-year period that he completes his theological studies. The internship requirements are that he gain experience in pastoral care, leading and planning worship services, teaching, preaching, evangelism and participation in special services and events. It also requires that I would serve as Billy's Internship Supervisor. In this role, I would be meeting with him weekly, overseeing his training and providing periodic progress reports to Niagara.

Constitutionally, approval of this internship does not require a vote of the congregation; however, the approval of Trinity members is highly recommended and desirable. It would represent an all-important recognition and legitimization of Billy's work among us as our Intern. It would also provide for a commitment on our part to be encouraging, to provide prayer support and to welcome and receive his work in ministry. Beyond all this, we can rejoice! God is at work! This is a beautiful example of how God extends His Call to raise up individuals from within the body of Christ to the ministry of Word and Sacrament. Please commit to prayer our thoughts as we look forward to our decision.

In addition to helping a Trinity brother complete his Certificate requirements, our acceptance of Billy as our Intern at Trinity is an opportunity for us to "give back" to and serve the larger church by involving ourselves in the training of one of our own

## SUMMER MISSION TO MOORE, OK

Maybe you have heard the buzz about our upcoming High School Student Impact Mission trip. I know our students and leaders are very excited about this summer's mission trip to Moore, OK. We will be teaming up with NEXT STEP MINISTRIES and six other LCMC churches from New Mexico, Minnesota, Colorado, Illinois and California to become a team ready to help with tornado recovery.

On May 20, 2013, a F5 tornado plundered through Moore, OK resulting in 23 deaths, 377 injuries and over \$2 billion in damages. This tornado destroyed an estimated 1,500 homes. In the aftermath, like most natural disasters, the rebuilding process can be complicated and messy: insurance money being held, FEMA money not coming through as planned, etc.

That's where NEXT STEP comes in with the help of various churches to pick up where first-response ends, partnering with families to rebuild. We will have the opportunity to work on home rebuilds and repairs including roofing, siding, flooring and dry walling. In the midst of brokenness, we will be there to share hope—the hope of Jesus Christ through taking time to listen as we serve alongside them.

This awesome opportunity will take place July 26 through August 2. Sign ups have begun and will continue thru February 10. This cut-off date is important as we need to get our Mission Team together to plan. I would like to encourage all high school students to be a part of rebuilding Moore this summer. As a faith congregation, please pray for us, our planning, our fundraising, the people of Moore and mostly our hearts and minds as we prepare for this life-changing opportunity. 


