- 13. Learning Bible memory work is a gift of God and not a work we have to labor over.
- 14. Getting up and going to church on Sunday morning is a good work. **T or F**
- 15. Giving a dollar each week in the church offering is a good work. **T or F**
- 16. What happens when the Law is viewed as the source of the Christian Life? See 2 Corinthians 3:4-6.
