

The Adventure of Discipleship

Before I talk about all the exciting new adventures that lie ahead of us as a new school year begins, I want to thank you, the congregation, for your participation in some wonderful gatherings that took place in August. On Sunday, we held our Back to School Bash and dedicated a brand new playground that will be used by our preschool, church, and community for years to



come. Earlier in the month, we held several events on the same weekend, including Vacation Bible School (VBS), overnight camping on our church grounds, outdoor worship with our Latino brothers and sisters, and the Fiesta! Many of you played a role in making all of these things happen. I left the next day for my spiritual retreat with a strong sense that the Holy Spirit of God had been at work amongst our community of faith. It was a great way to leave town!

As I return, we are now easing into the school year and many activities are beginning. I encourage you to please sit down and take time to explore the rest of this newsletter to see what is happening. More importantly, I challenge you to pray as you read, and ask God to show you a place within our community of faith where you might connect with others this Fall. If you've been putting it off, for whatever reason, don't put it off any longer. Now is the time!

As you will see, we have many places for people of all ages to grow in faith in our various growth groups. Many of these are offered on Sunday mornings, woven around our morning worship schedule. Others are offered as part of Community Night, which is back on Thursday evenings. Still others happen at various times during the week. There are also special events and opportunities to serve in hands-on ways. Be on the lookout for those as well.

Finally, please make a renewed commitment to join with the gathered community for worship on Sunday mornings at one of our three services (8:00 – Chapel, 9:15 – Sanctuary, 11:11 – Kindling in Fellowship Hall). As we worship this fall, I will be speaking and teaching about something that John Wesley (founder of Methodism) called "the means of grace." I'm calling it "Walking in the Ways of God" because these "means of grace" are really things we do as we journey with God to position ourselves so that the grace of God can be at work in our lives.

Think of it this way: we are about to embark on a great adventure together. What are the skills we need to not only survive, but to really thrive, as we go from place to place? We will talk about what it means to be a disciple: What, really is a disciple? We will talk about grace: What does God's grace have to do with me? And then we will dig into these specific "ways of God." You know some of them already: baptism, communion, praying, searching the Scriptures, fellowship, works of mercy, and so on. But, in some cases, we will come to a new understanding of what John Wesley meant when he described them for the early Methodist disciples. I believe that these are essential tools and skills for us to carry with us as we seek the future that God has for us, and eventually, we go to exciting places we've not been before. More about that in worship... Until then, God's grace be among you!

Fall Sunday School


Sunday, September 10th will be the official start up date for Sunday school classes for the Fall. Come join in a class this fall.


