- Knowledgeable of any OSHA or other governmental agency (such as EPA, Board of Health, fire code, AHERA, etc.) requirements in order to maintain all health and safety standards.
- Monitor all furniture and equipment in the building and report any vandalism or major maintenance needs to the Pastor and Trustees.
- 5. Maintain outside building appearance.
- 6. Maintain proper inventory/supply levels and distribute as needed.
- Coordinate scheduling and performance of special work projects with the staff and members.
- 8. Perform general maintenance, such as ballast replacement, changing light bulbs, toilet repair, etc. Report major repair needs to the pastor and trustees.
- Maintain the outside of the building such as snow removal, salting, grass trimming, general cleanliness, leaf raking, courtyard appearance, etc.
- 10. Set-up various meeting areas with tables and chairs, TV/DVD players etc.

11. Perform other tasks as assigned by the pastor.

Africa

• Praise God for a strong sentence late last month in the case of a man who sexually abused a mother and her daughter in Kenya. The abuser, a local pastor, was visiting the family when he used his position of authority to take advantage of the woman and child, who has autism. With IJM's involvement, a Kenyan court found the man guilty and sentenced him to life in prison. Please pray for the survivors, and pray that word of the sentence would spread and would deter other violent men from abusing the vulnerable.

Latin America

• Praise God for a rescue operation last week that freed 15 women from an international sex trafficking ring in the Dominican Republic. Ending a two-year investigation that spanned multiple countries, IJM partnered with anti-trafficking police to arrest three suspects for exploiting the women from a bar in Santo Domingo. The women were trafficked to the city from South America

and are working with IJM to receive legal and aftercare services. Please pray that the women's status as foreigners would not block their access to much-needed counseling, medical care, and other assistance.

South Asia

• Praise God for a successful rescue operation this week that freed six young girls from sexual exploitation. IJM partnered with anti-trafficking police to find the girls, who were being held in a private home in an unassuming suburban area. Four traffickers have been arrested. Please pray for the girls' recovery as they settle in a caring aftercare home and for follow-up on these arrests.

Southeast Asia

• Pray for strengthened partnerships with the Thai central government as officials consider ways to help eligible hill tribe people become citizens. IJM's team from Chiang Mai traveled to Bangkok recently to meet with key leaders, and we were encouraged by that meeting. Pray that our advocacy would result in citizenship for many more people who are legally entitled to it because they were born or grew up in Thailand. Pray that the barriers of bureaucracy and prejudice would crumble as more government leaders become advocates for justice.

IJM has partner offices in Australia, Canada, Germany, the Netherlands, and the UK.




