A Message from the Pastor

Where it Fits and if it Fits Wear It

This is a busy season and if I were smart I should keep this short. Hopefully I will. We are running around this season at a quicker pace than previous years, or so it seems. Part of the reason may be the exhausting election season which we must now put aside in order to prepare for the rest of the holiday season. That's right, we are already here! We rush with our families, at work and in the church as well.

Where and how will we fit everything in? That is the big question that haunts us all. It seems appropriate that our theme for The Advent Season comes from Dicken's *Christmas Carol*. That is the story of Ebeneezer Scrooge and his horrible, sleepless, night facing the ghosts of Christmas past, present and future. And while there are many ways we may relate to the story we would all nod our heads in recognizing we, like Scrooge, find the busyness and "work" of our lives takes over and leave little time for anything else.

The staff and leaders in the church have planned for a wonderful Advent Season. It has been work as well I confess! Our theme *God Bless Us Everyone- The Redemption of Scrooge* will be the focus of our worship services. We are joined by bells and instrumentalists on Sunday mornings as well. And of course we will come together at both our 5 pm Christmas Eve Pageant and our 11 pm Christmas Communion Service. Also, each Wednesday morning we have a study using Matt Rawle's book The Redemption of Scrooge.

I would end with one small note that has come from our Wednesday morning study using Philip Yancey's book <u>Prayer</u>. There Yancey quotes the great scholar and Rabbi Abraham Heschel. When Hesechel was told the liturgy for worship did not express what people felt his response was the point of the liturgy was not as much for the liturgy to express what they felt as for people to feel what the liturgy expressed! Perhaps both are true.

We need to be open to the influence of God's Spirit as we gather together and celebrate this great gift, this great mystery, known as Emmanuel- God with us.

LOCAL: **Zufall Highlands** COMMUNITY PROGRAMS **Medical Van** -Zufall Health

was founded 25 years ago by Dr. Robert Zufall and his wife, Kathryn when they opened a small community health clinic in Dover. This mission has expanded to multiple sights and services across northern New Jersey. Zufall provides affordable and competent healthcare to members of the communities who would otherwise be underserved. The **Zufall Highlands Medical Van** travels to those who cannot reach one of their clinics. In an expanded program, the van offers medical services to migrants workers in the agricultural areas of New Jersey. INTERNATIONAL: *Heifer International* - Empowers families to turn hunger and poverty into hope and prosperity by bringing sustainable agriculture and commerce to communities with a long history of poverty. The gifts of animals provide partners with both food and reliable income, as agricultural products such as milk, eggs and honey can be traded or sold at market. The program also includes a Passing On of Skills and Animals where the first recipient gives the first born female to a neighbor and also trains that neighbor to care and raise the animals and use their products.

Other Outreach news

UNITED METHODISTS join GIVING TUESDAY on November 29

UMCOR - Is addressing health and life savings issues for children in **Liberia** through the Advance Special **Abundant Health: Our Promise to Children Initiative**, with goals to reach 1 million children with lifesaving interventions by 2020. Fourteen years of civil war, followed by the devastating Ebola epidemic, have left Liberia's physical infrastructure, including roads, in a disastrous state making access to the limited health care facilities evenmore difficult. With donations motorbikes and medical transport vehicles enable rural community members to reach health care.

Thank you for your support of the Market Street Mission Annual Coat Drive. We delivered about 55 coats plus hats, gloves and scarves, which joined thousands of others donated for the distribution on Saturday, November 5th on the Green in Morristown. Leah, Jaelyn & Kira Atterbury, Felix Tshinbang, Kathy SHoaf and Jeanne Eisele had a great experience joining other volunteers assisting individuals to find coats for all members of their families.

AFWH- A Future with Hope Update

To date the results include completion of restoration of 247 homes, 18 homes under construction, 10 homes in queue. Hosted 11,540 volunteers at 10 host sites with a 300 person hosting capacity.

The Family Promise clients will have a special Holiday Season in 2016 thanks to the Angel Tree project sponsored by UMC Madison's Youth and Outreach Ministries. Our congregation is asked to choose an Angel from the tree in the library with a specific gift request and purchase that gift for the clients. The gifts will be delivered in time for distribution at the Family Promise Holiday Party on Tuesday, December 20. If anyone if interested in attending the Holiday Party, let me know and I will give further information on time and location.

I'm pleased to report that Family Promise was awarded a grant of \$5000 from the Jones Fund, which will be used for the Keys to Housing/Landlord Tenant program, recently established by Family Promise to locate and secure permanent housing for clients and to provide support, education and training to insure that the clients will be able to become self-sufficient and remain in their new homes permanently. The program strives to make affordable housing a win-win situation for the renters and the landlords.

Our next time to help St. Vincent's Church in hosting the families will be in February 2017. Specific information will be in the next edition of the Message.
