

### Team Vital

want to introduce you to a project that we are undertaking as a church that will produce a ministry action plan which will promote vitality and fruitfulness in our congregation and guide our work long into the future. It's called **Team Vital** and is being facilitated by The United Methodist Church of Greater New Jersey.

The goal of Team Vital is to enable local churches to assess who they are as a congregation and the community around them, equip their leadership in understanding the five markers of vitality and create a ministry plan that will lead to vitality. All of which will lead to making disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world.

UMCGNJ has identified five markers of vitality:

**Worship** - Inspiring worship that invites people into a deeper faith

**Making New Disciples** - Reaching and making new disciples **Small Groups** - Engaging people to grow their faith through small groups

Mission - Engaging people in missions

**Giving** - Encouraging generosity

We will be meeting as an individual group and also with other churches in Northern New Jersey over the course of 18-24 months. During the course of Team Vital, congregational teams will engage in a dynamic process that will identify the assets that form ministry, the challenges facing the congregation and a path for engaging in the community and growing vitality. At the end of the training, each team will have a ministry plan that will guide their growth and development.

We ask for your prayers as we undertake this process for our congregation and for the future of our church.



St. Andrews UMC Fills Need with Food Pantry

**St. Andrews UMC** in Cherry Hill, NJ, is a founding partner of the Cherry Hill Food Pantry, which was started in 2007. The pantry has grown from a small room in a church basement to a recently opened store front in a shopping center. The pantry is open twice a week, receives between 70 and 80 people each time it is open and has 900 families registered in its database. Operating much the same as the Interfaith Food Pantry of Morris County, the families come in once a month to pick out the food. It also requires the hands and hearts of many volunteers to keep the pantry open and stocked for the clients. There are now 13 churches of various faiths that help with the volunteer effort. The new store front site in Cherry Hill includes six industrial size freezers and four regular refrigerators to keep the meats, fruits and vegetables cold. There is also a back entrance where food is delivered to a storage room where it is sorted.

### AFWH- A Future with Hope Update

To date the results include completion of restoration of 200 homes complete, 26 homes under construction, 10,713 volunteers,15 host sites, 383 person hosting capacity, 424 home owners and families supported through case management. AFWH continues to work in communities across GNJ area.
