# Wake Up Pastor Stephen Kaneshiro

The events of Easter proved that Jesus sacrificed much for all of us. He suffered and died because of His great love for you and me. We need to figure out how we can be a pleasing aroma that will bless and glorify the Lord, Jesus Christ. As I have been thinking and praying about how can do this, the phrase "Wake Up" continually comes to my mind.

As I looked this phrase up and began to study it, the Lord brought three passages to me. The first is John 4:35 where the Lord emphasizes that *now* is the time to work because the harvest is ready. Therefore I need to wake up and get to work.

The second is Romans 13:11 where the call to wake up is so urgent due to the time of Salvation being so near.

The last passage is Revelation 3:1-3 where another urgent call to wake up is being made, and the consequences of failing to heed this call will result in the Lord coming "to you suddenly, as unexpected as a thief."

John 4:35 (NLT) You know the saying, 'Four months between planting and harvest.' But I say, wake up and look around. The fields are already ripe for harvest.

This passage causes great concern because I realize that when the fields are ripe and it is not harvested, the harvest begins to rot. I am concerned that the church has been asleep for far too long, and the harvest has begun to rot. If this is true, the church needs to wake up and save all that can be saved, otherwise, it will get more and more difficult for the good fruit to be harvested.

The church will be held responsible by the Lord for the rotting fruit, because we wasted our time in slumber. Therefore, the call to wake up is a serious call that comes with devastating consequences if we ignore it. It is very important that we continue to issue the call for Valley Isle Fellowship to wake up so that we can be a part of the solution rather than a part of the problem.

Romans 13:11 (NLT) This is all the more urgent, for you know how late it is; time is running out. Wake up, for our salvation is nearer now than when we first believed.

This passage once again emphasizes that time is running out and we have to be genuine and sincere in our love for our God and to love others the way that He commands. It is important to note that so many intend to do this, but they keep putting it off for another day. They intend to do it, but when that day

comes and they haven't done it, all the best intentions in the world will mean nothing.

This is a call for the church to wake up and be the church that God has called us to be. How long do you think you will have the opportunity to respond? The time may be shorter than you ever thought. Remember, that the best intentions will mean nothing if you fail to "wake up."

Revelation 3:1-3 (NLT) <sup>1</sup>"Write this letter to the angel of the church in Sardis. This is the message from the one who has the sevenfold Spirit of God and the seven stars: "I know all the things you do, and that you have a reputation for being alive—but you are dead. <sup>2</sup>Wake up! Strengthen what little remains, for even what is left is almost dead. I find that your actions do not meet the requirements of my God. <sup>3</sup>Go back to what you heard and believed at first; hold to it firmly. Repent and turn to me again. If you don't wake up, I will come to you suddenly, as unexpected as a thief."

This final passage says that if you don't wake up that He will come suddenly like a thief. A thief comes when you least expect him to, but he also comes to do you harm. He comes to steal from you and to take whatever he desires, regardless of how much you may need or desire it. Therefore, the Lord is warning of a very desperate time of sudden loss. This will be a very troublesome time and extremely painful. This all happens because we refuse to wake up.

However, the Lord is also saying that there may still be time to wake up and strengthen what little remains. What remains may almost be dead, but there may still be time to wake up and bring new life into them. However, if the call to wake up continued on page 2

# Why Does Jesus Seem Distant From Me?


**D**o you ever feel that God and Jesus are distant from you? You read the Bible, pray, attend church and help serve but somehow the Lord still seems far from you rather than near to you? You believe you're doing things right, however there's a question looming in your mind as to whether or not you are doing the right things.


Many Christians believe in God, Jesus and everything that is written in the Bible. We call that "doctrine". Doctrine is defined as a set of beliefs and understanding of God. Pastor J.D. Greear says, "God seems more distant-more like a doctrine I knew about than a person I knew." He goes on to say, "I never want to downplay the important role of doctrine, but Christianity is more than doctrine. It is a relationship and experience that grows out of doctrine. We can never know God apart from Scripture, but knowing Scripture isn't the same as knowing God. Without doctrine, we have no way of interpreting our experiences; but without experience, our doctrine has no point."

So how can you have a close relationship with Jesus? Believing in the Gospel is more than having an awareness of God's love or even knowing and understanding the truth of Scripture. The main point of Christianity is the presence of God and Jesus in you. In John 14:18 Jesus said, "I will not leave you as orphans I will come to you." At this time, Jesus was preparing His disciples for His crucifixion and assuring them that He was not going to leave them alone. True or false? Jesus gave his disciples assignments and tasks by giving them commands to follow through on their own because He was leaving them after the crucifixion? The answer is false because He just said He was not leaving them as orphans. So how did Jesus promise that He was still going to be with them and among them even though they would not be able to see Him?

In John 14:16-17 Jesus says, "<sup>16</sup> And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Advocate, who will never leave you. <sup>17</sup> He is the Holy Spirit, who leads into all truth. The world cannot receive him, because it isn't looking for him and doesn't recognize him. But you know him, because he lives with you now and later will be in you." Jesus is in us because the Holy Spirit is in us. We believe that the Trinity, the nature of one God in three persons, is God the Father, God the Son, God the Holy Spirit. When you experience one, you experience all three.

The Apostle Peter was preaching the Gospel to the Jews in Acts 2:38 when he replied, "<sup>38</sup>Each of you must repent of your sins and turn to God, and be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins. Then you will receive the gift of the Holy





The presence of the Holy Spirit in you is the close presence of Jesus with you. In the words of Peter we need to repent, turn to God and be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ. We need to believe that He forgives us of our sins and we will receive the Holy Spirit. Reading the Bible helps you interpret your experiences with Jesus. Praying to Jesus gives you the opportunity to see Jesus at work in and around your life. Serving others gives you the privilege of being a part of the power of Jesus at work in you and everyone else and to see and feel His love. I pray that the combination of the knowledge and experiences of Jesus in and through the Holy Spirit will always assure you that He is near and never distant from you!



# Stop Just Going To Church By Jeff Vanderstelt

It all began in a boat on a lake with a few fishing poles. It was there, surrounded by the lazy water, my dad and I would have a key conversation that would change the trajectory of my life. My dad was giving me a simple update on his life and shared that his church was hiring a discipleship pastor. After I pushed past my internal dialog about how hiring a pastor for discipleship betrayed that the church didn't see everything they did as discipleship, I heard my father say he was excited to learn how to make disciples—finally.

I was thankful for my father's surge of energy toward Jesus' commission but also a bit troubled. My dad didn't seemed to realize he raised me in a home where daily life was engaged as intentional ministry. He owned several small businesses and believed his business was meant to be a blessing to people and the city we lived in. As a result, we joined our parents in countless acts of kindness, generosity, and hospitality.

It was not uncommon for one of us four boys to give up our room for a season to make room for a young man getting a fresh start, a broken husband whose marriage was on the rocks, or a runaway teen who needed some stability. My dad would love



and mentor these men during the day at one of his businesses while my mom would nurture and care for them like one of her own.

I watched young and old come to know the love of Jesus and receive very informal but effective training in how to become responsible, hard-working, loving men. Because of my parents' ministry at home and at work, many men still call our family "their own."

**However, the church never called this "ministry."** They didn't see that my mother's gracious hospitality and my father's mentoring through work created both the environment and means for discipleship to happen.

I was not saddened simply because my parents' ministry was never legitimized; Jesus was working through it all along, and God the Father was pleased to watch His children at work. What saddened me was that many churches (and many in the church) don't view their homes as one of the best contexts for ministry, and their workplaces are some of the most overlooked places for mentoring and mission.

Most people will spend one third of their lives at work and at least another third in or around their homes; that means that more than two-thirds of our lives are considered non-ministry space. In addition, most still believe church is a place you **go** for one-to-four hours a week where most of the discipleship happens. **This means a very large majority of Christians see only a very small percentage of their lives dedicated to the mission of making disciples.** It's no wonder so few believers are fruitful in ministry.
