

## TESTINIONY OF A LIFE CHANGED: VRNI RECOVERY PROGRAM

My name is Donnie, I came to the VRM on Jan. 16, 2011. After a twenty year addiction to meth I came to realize God had more for me. By isolating myself from family and friends I was losing control of my life and everything I had worked so hard for, I was spiritually dead. Work has always came easy to me, but as jobs started to disappear due to budget cuts, business closures, and state layoffs I found myself jobless, homeless and for the first time in my life, searching for what God had for me. Since entering the program I have given my life to Christ as my Lord and Savior. While participating in the program, through the classes, I am learning about Jesus' love for me and



my addiction has
affected my life. Now I find myself
being involved in Church, surrounding
myself with other godly men and building solid relationships. God is teaching
me how to love and forgive others as
well as myself, helping me to be the
authentic man He created me to be.

### Recovery Program for Men and Women

Our Spiritual Training and Educational Program (S.T.E.P.)
was developed to assist those who seek to escape the
slavery of addiction and sin. The core program is nine
months with additional aftercare services available for up
to a year following graduation.

### Men's Program: Updated!

- VRM Men's Program has graduated 4 men over the summer.
- All 4 of our graduates have obtained employment.
- All 4 are still currently living on our property in transitional housing.
- We have opened our new transitional living 4-plex

- 4-plex is currently housing 8 graduates of the VRM men's program.
- New "block programming" was implemented. Block programming consists of one two month "half step" entry block, 3 two month spiritual formation & life skills/recovery blocks, and 1 three month transitional block.

I was at the Bob Wiley Detention Center looking at 2 years in prison when I first heard about the House of Hope. I really wasn't interested in another residential recovery program, especially one that was 9 months long...but I had heard positive things about the House of Hope and apparently God and the Judge thought it would be a good place for me. Never in all my previous attempts at recovery have I experienced the kind of healing that I have received since I entered the House of Hope and turned my life over to Christ and now I feel encouraged to share with others what God has done in my life.

I am currently in the work experience phase of the program and I'm excited to be interning at Grace Homes as a "spiritual advisor". Because of my troubled past I always dreamed of working with troubled youth but I never imagined that I would be used as a "spiritual advisor", God does have a sense of humor. It is awesome to be used by God and I feel He is using me to love these girls at the home, listen to them and pray for them...not push religion on them. When one of the girls becomes disruptive, staff will call on me to take a walk with the girl until she calms down...what a privilege!

I had heard about the House of Hope while at Bob Wiley and three days after being released decided I would give it a try. I feel the program was just what I needed...a place to find God and myself. I have recently completed Phase 1 of the program and I have started my internship at Ben-e-lect.

I have been truly blessed since I started interning at Ben-e-lect, everyone has been so welcoming and nonjudgmental even though they know I am in recovery. I really appreciate the time the staff spends investing in me and every day I look forward to the new things I am going to learn. I always wanted to work in an office setting but never thought I was smart enough but I am learning that "I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me..."

At first I was really nervous about having to leave the House of Hope for the day to go to work because I felt safe and protected there, but now I am so glad to have this opportunity to learn independence through baby steps. Since my internship started I am gaining new work skills which has given me more confidence in



As I ride my bike to and from work I find that it is the perfect time to talk to and listen to God and I cherish that time with Him. God has been teaching me that my worth is found in Him and I am growing more and more confident in who I am in Christ.

I feel extremely blessed to have this opportunity to ease back into functional living and I'm grateful to the businesses that help make this unique opportunity a possibility.

## Lance Van Grouw

On August 7th, 2011 Lance Van Grouw was in an accident while slip n' sliding with his friends. He was airlifted to the Community Regional Medical Center in Fresno, CA and couldn't feel anything below his collar bone. He is partially paralyzed from his chest down and is now on the road to recovery! His doctors and Physical Therapists are hopeful, but at this point there is no way of knowing how much healing Lance's body will do. All we can do is hope and pray that The Great Physician will allow him a full recovery. We put all of our trust in the Lord and will not cease praying for Lance!
