Father's Day

My Dad Knows God

My small boy was playing with his buddies in the backyard. One day I overheard them talking. The conversation was, amusingly, one of those "I can whip your dad" routines. One boy proudly said, "My dad knows the mayor of our town!" Another said, "That's nothing – my dad knows the governor of our state!"

Wondering what was coming next in the program of bragging, I heard my son say, "That's nothing-my dad knows God!" I swiftly slipped away from my place of eavesdropping with tears on my cheeks. I dropped to my knees in my room and prayed earnestly and gratefully, "Oh God, I pray that my boy will always be able to say, "My Dad knows God."

Because of work and busy schedules many fathers are not able to spend a lot of time with their children. Maybe that is why one cartoonist drew the characterization of a young boy standing next to his father's recliner. The father was engrossed in the sports page, while the impatient boy pounded the leather of his baseball glove. Finally, the energetic little guy said, "play with me or trade me!"

First-graders were asked to draw a picture of God in their Sunday school class. Their finished products contained some interesting theology. One child depicted God in the form of a brightly colored rainbow. Another presented him as an old man coming out of the clouds. An intense little boy drew God with a remarkable resemblance to Superman. The best snapshot came from a little girl. She said, "I didn't know what God looked like, so I just drew a picture of my daddy." When we live godly lives, people will see God.

A prayer dedicated to fathers: Our Father, as we prepare to celebrate Father's Day, we are grateful that we can call you Father. By addressing You as Father we are aware that this expresses the love, the care, the protection, and the provision that You have given to us. Help us as earthly fathers, our Father, to express some of these same qualities in our relationships. You are infinite and all-knowing; we are finite and so limited in our knowledge. Help us to pattern our lives on you and to use what knowledge we have in an effort to find and to do Your will personally and in our families.

In First Timothy, we read that to be a man of God, it is important to follow after righteousness, godliness, faith, love, patience, and meekness. (I Timothy 6:11).

These are qualities that we all can embrace as we try to live out our faith.

A note from the Servant Leadership Team: An Update on Upcoming Pastoral Changes at Wesley

The Dakotas Cabinet is working to identify and place an interim pastor to serve one year beginning approximately July 15. This planned interim period will give our congregation an opportunity to heal and to think intentionally about next steps for our church. The deliberate interim period will also allow the Dakotas Cabinet to place our church in the normal cycle of appointments for 2018. We expect this longer-term interim to be announced in the next 1-2 weeks.

As Rev. Randy Cross has reminded us through the spring, the work of Wesley church continues, and the first work is prayer. So, please continue to encircle our congregation in prayer and love. While this has been a difficult time, I know God has been, and will continue to be, with us. Let us make it our response to be faithful in our worship, our presence, and our giving. 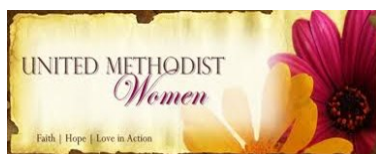

DID YOU KNOW?

Each of Wesley's women's circles support a mission project either national, state or local.

LYDIA-RUTH-RACHEL Circle: Mission Interest—Red Bird Mission

Red Bird Mission—located in Beverly, Kentucky serves the needs in South Eastern Kentucky, the Appalachian Mountain region established in 1921 by United Methodists to provide educational, health and community outreach in the rural distressed area.

MARY-MARTHA Circle: Mission Interest—Henderson Settlement

Henderson Settlement—located at Frakes, Kentucky started in 1925. Its mission is to meet basic human needs in Appalachia. Throughout the year, Mary-Martha brings pennies or any coin to each circle meeting. At Christmas they send them to Henderson.

NEW GENERATION Women: Mission Interest—Spirit Lake Ministries

Spirit Lake Ministries—located at Devils Lake, ND. New Generation has collected new and used clothing and delivered to them, had the congregation fill Christmas shoe boxes, and put together Layettes and health kits for UMCOR.

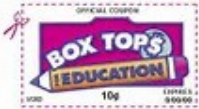
SARAH-FAITH Circle: Mission Interest—Gordon and Ardell Graner

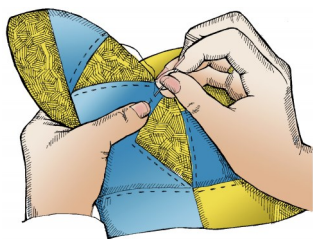

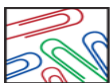
