

### A Financial Snapshot

As we enter into the mid-year, I want to give you a financial snapshot as to where we are in our missional giving for the ministry of Wesley. First, to all of you who made a pledge to support the missional work of Wesley UMC this past fall, thank you! When you make a pledge, it allows us to effectively plan for ministry in the coming year. As a result, we are able to make a difference in the lives of people both in the Charleston area and all around the world.

Last November, \$365,516 was pledged to the overall budget of this church for the 2015 calendar year. Comparatively, in October of 2013, \$291,044 was pledged for the 2014 budget. That represents an increase of \$74,472 in money pledged.

The 2015 budget for this year at Wesley is \$544,981. That leaves \$179,465 that we must make up through unpledged Sunday morning offerings as well as money that is already designated for specific usages from generous gifts, donations and bequests that are in "designated accounts" that can only be used for its designation.

Every year, we will have an opportunity in the mid fall to ask God, "What is it you want to give to the mission of Wesley UMC through me?" This simple question makes our giving an act of faith. And when we respond to God's leading, we are following in faith.

To some, a budget may appear as sterile numbers on a page. To me, the budget represents programs to connect people to God; improvements on the building to best demonstrate hospitality to those who come here; the missional work of the Church; leadership development and stewarding the ministry that has been entrusted to us for this time, namely, Wesley UMC.

Thank you again for your faithful giving to the life and ministry of Charleston Wesley UMC. Your faithful giving is funding ministry and changing lives.



We will be offering an evening Bible study beginning **Thursday**, **June 25**, at **7:00 P.M.** in the church parlor. Written by bestselling author John




Ortberg, this six-week session combines video and class discussion (using a participant's guide).

# JUNE MISSION PROJECT



The Missions Work Area has selected Africa University Endowment

Scholarship as our June Mission Project. At the 2013 Annual meeting of our Illinois Great Rivers Conference (IGRC), lay and clergy members voted to establish a \$1 million, two-year Endowment Scholarship Campaign beginning in 2015. Congregations were asked to make pledges toward the achievement of this important goal. The Missions Work Area, in consultation with Rev. Swickard, has set a goal for Wesley UMC of \$2,500 for 2015.

The development of Africa University was a result of the growth of United Methodism in Africa. The idea of establishing a university began in the 1980s, and it received its official charter in 1992. Africa University is located in Zimbabwe, and IGRC has designated this effort as "Making Dreams Possible." The conference currently offers four endowed scholarships with existing funds on hand. The results have been outstanding. Melvin Payekar of Liberia, for example, received an IGRC scholarship and has returned to his home country to work for a non-governmental organization for treating and preventing Ebola which has ravaged Liberia this past year. This new scholarship campaign would provide funding for eight scholarships, annually, for the life of the institution. (Continued, next page)

### A WORD FROM CHURCH & SOCIETY

From CCDCC to Charleston Community Early Learning Center:

On July 1 the Charleston Community Day Care Center takes on a new name—the Charleston Community Early Learning Center. This renaming better reflects the centrality of education and child development to the mission of this long-standing partner of WUMC. With this profile, we highlight

key facets of another important organization assisted through the budget of the Work Area on Church and Society.

The Charleston Community Early Learning Center is a non-profit organization established in 1968, with WUMC central to its origins and ongoing existence. WUMC has supported the Center over the years through providing building space, with monthly payments to the Church for costs associated with building use (e.g., heating/cooling, electricity, water, etc.). Without this facility and financial relationship, the Center really would not be possible, particularly since it operates on a very tight budget. Also reflective of the importance of WUMC, 3 of the 9 seats on the Center's Board of Directors are WUMC members.

The children at the Center range in age from 6 weeks on through 10 years old, and the Center serves a diverse group of children. Also, some of the Center's children have special needs, and 25 to 40% of the families receive State assistance. Revenues for the Center are derived from a variety of sources, primarily from parent fees (65-70% of the total); state government child care payments (20-25%); USDA food program assistance (5-6 %); and other sources such as the United Way, the Charleston Charitable Foundation, and individual contributions (5-6 %).

WUMC members can directly help the Center in a number of ways, including contributions to the annual development campaign; assistance with funds needed for updating the lighted sign on Fourth Street; and donations such as school supplies at the beginning of the school year. The Center's Director Barbara Warmouth always has a list of what is needed; she can be reached at 345-3111.

Gifts have been given to our Memorial Fund in memory of Robert Gillespie, Jerry Heath and Carolyn Paul.

### **SCOUT NEWS**

Wesley's Boy Scout Troop 141 planted 25 Red Bud trees on Arbor Day at Charleston schools. The scouts also participated in monthly service projects at the Charleston Food Pantry, and at PADS in Mattoon, and as a fundraiser have been cleaning O'Brien Stadium following each day of the state high school track meets. On Memorial Day, Wesley's Scouts posted flags on Lincoln for the VFW, and participated with them in the commemoration service Rose Cemetery. The troop later observed its own custom at the cemetery, firing 21 minute gun rounds at noon, when flags are traditionally raised to full staff. Samuel White passed his board of review to become our 33rd Eagle Scout. The Troop currently has 14 Life Scouts, the last rank prior to achieving Eagle. Twenty-nine of our scouts and six adults will be heading to Rhodes-France Scout Reservation near Pana for camp this month.
