From Dan's Desk



New Life

This past winter was one for the record books. Indeed it was a record, as it went down, as the snowiest Ohio Valley winter ever, eclipsing the winter of 77-78 (remember the January '78 blizzard?) Meteorologist say it had something to do with what they call the "polar vortex", an unusually cold mass of North Pole air that dipped down into our temperate regions. If you were like me you may have begun to wonder if winter would ever end.

But it did. Winter has given way to the inexorable march of the sun higher in the sky, it's increasing strength warming the earth once again. The snow is gone, the grass is green, and the birds are singing— all indicative of the new life granted the earth by the sun's warming rays.

And just as the sun brings new life to earth, so also does Jesus bring His new life to all who receive Him. I am reminded of that paragraph of scripture in Revelation 1:16 which says of Jesus that "His face was like the sun shining in all its brilliance." When John received his vision of Jesus on Patmos that is what he saw. Jesus in His resurrection power was beaming with the brilliance of His new life.

That new life which Jesus gives is available to all who know and follow Him. And His promise to all who do know and follow Him is sure- "Because I live, you too shall live" (john 14:19) Like snow melting before the strength of a spring sun, so also the grave cannot repel the power of the new life Jesus gives to those who believe in Him. Jesus spoke the most powerful words uttered by any man when He declared: "I am the resurrection and the life . He who believes in me will live , even though he dies." (John 11:25) Jesus backed up that claim by raising His friend Lazarus from the dead and later by His own resurrection that first Easter morning. Death could not hold Jesus anymore than winter can hold back the sun in its strength from chasing winter away. This new life is our hope, our promise, and the reason we rejoice as we celebrate the resurrection of our Lord.

MISSION SPOTLIGHT

Received this from Philokalia Ministries and thought I would share it with you. Dear Friends and Supporters of Philokalia Ministries:

This update will focus on two particular matters of current concern; another update on current ministry activities will follow in a few days.

First, we have had inquiries regarding our personal safety in view of recent reports in U.S. media about bomb attacks here in Chiang Mai, so we want to let you know that we are well, and to provide some information. Last Friday evening, three places were attacked with grenades launched from outside their premises: a gas station, a brewery and a restaurant, with the attacks occurring within an hour of each other, probably all carried out by the same persons. There were injuries reported only at the gas station, where four were injured, one seriously. Thai police are investigating and are tending toward a theory of being politically motivated. Political tensions are still high in Thailand, especially in light of the Constitution Court's ruling late last week that the called elections held on Feb. 2 are invalid due to some polling places being blocked by protesters. Since then public political rhetoric has ratcheted up once again, while it appears that it could be months before another election can be held. Meanwhile, the current government remains in caretaker status, which limits their powers to some extent, and remains under pressure from several fronts. It is hard to say how this will all come out, but we would appreciate your joining with us and our Thai Christian brothers and sisters in prayer for this country we all love and for peaceful settlement of current political issues; rhetoric about possible major violent conflict resulting from current tensions is quite disturbing.

Secondly, we are concerned about the financial status of Philokalia Ministries. Taking account of all regular support received through the 3rd week of March, funds received this year are much lower than expected and needed. General fund giving in January was \$3,423.98, in February was \$5,381.98, and to date in March \$3,554.90, while to meet our budget fully requires an average of \$6,773.68 (some additional giving for special purposes have also been received). We always maintain a cushion in the Philokalia Ministries bank account (our board has stipulated we try to keep enough to cover two months expenses on hand at all times) to maintain cash flow during periods of low income that occur from time to time, and to cover some of our expenses which are front-loaded (for instance, we must pay three months worth of rent for our house at the beginning of each quarter, totaling about \$1,400 per quarter). However, if the current trend continues very much longer, that cushion will be significantly reduced, or could even be eliminated.

We have been making every attempt to reduce our expenditures, <u>especially in light of an additional loss of regular support from two churches in 2013, totaling \$410 per month,</u> which resulted from changes being made within those churches. We were able to reduce our health insurance costs for this year by nearly \$3,900 over 2013 by taking out a shorter-term plan for our coverage here in Thailand until our return stateside (however, new coverage stateside will be needed after that); and costs of our travel for our final return to the U.S. in September have been greatly reduced through use of frequent flier miles for our international tickets and by obtaining a good deal on the domestic tickets needed. <u>But with current giving levels, we are now contemplating making spending cuts that will affect ministry</u>.

Please help us to make a smooth and strong transition, both of our work over to our Thai team and church and back to life in the U.S. for Pam and I, according to the plan which we shared with you last year, through your continued prayers and giving, for which we are always grateful.

Please be on the lookout for our next ministry update in a few days.

"This is one of the nicest guys in the business," Bill Gaither tells his Homecoming audience. "Ladies and Gentlemen, Dallas Holm!"

As he approaches the mic, the band begins playing the introduction to "Rise Again." Although Dallas Holm has written many songs, this is the one the audience knows and expects to hear him sing "in concert." The audience applauds accordingly, as he begins to sing, "Go ahead, drive the nails in My Hands."

Dallas Holm was born November 6, 1948 in St. Paul, Minn. Like many Baby Boomers, he wanted to be a rock star. He began playing the guitar. By 16, he was playing in local bands. People began noticing the aspiring musician. Fellow church members noticed too.

"One night, the pastor of our local church sat down and talked with me about my life, my music, and Jesus. On October 17, 1965, I committed my life and my music to the Lord. I've never looked back," Holm told one interviewer. In another interview, he added, "(M)y life was radically and eternally transformed."

After Bible school and a brief youth ministry, Holm became worship leader for David Wilkerson's ministry in the early 1970s. At that time, Wilkerson's ministry centered around his work with inner city youth in tough neighborhoods. Some of his work had been chronicled in his best-selling book, "The Cross and the Switchblade."

Holm relocated to Texas and began his new job. He also began working on a new LP for Singcord Records. There was a problem—Zondervan, Singcord's owner, wanted original material. He had none.

Looking for inspiration on his own, he found none. Finally, he prayed about it. Part of his prayer included the question, "Lord, if you were singing, what would You sing?" ("Complete Book of Hymns" by the Petersens, p. 604) The music began flowing from his pen. Holm explained, "God wrote the song(s) and I just delivered the message." (ibid, p. 604)

His first Singcord LP, "For Teens Only," was released in 1971. It inspired and influenced many young Christians and Christian musicians, including singer-songwriter Twila Paris. A few years later, she would be the opening act for Holm's concerts. (Later, she became an established hitmaker with songs such as "Do I Trust You?")

"Rise Again" appeared on his 1977 LP, "Live!" It won four Dove Awards, including "Song of the Year." Although he has been nominated and won other awards for other songs and recordings through the years, "Rise Again" became his most famous song.

Holm commented in another interview, "When people hear my music or see me on TV or in concert, they don't realize that these are just moments in my life. I've had my struggles, heartaches, and disappointments just like everyone else.... But Christ remains pre-eminent in all things."

Holm's challenges in his life include raising a young family and keeping them grounded in Christ while maintaining his career and ministry. Another involves his wife Linda (whom he married in 1969), who has battled cancer for many years.

These challenges, no doubt, supplied some of the inspiration for his CD, "Songs of Hope and Comfort." According to his website:

"(Many) people have commented on how a particular song got them through a a difficult season of their life. In time of loss and sorrow, sickness and trial, a song was often the instrument of God's grace. It is for this reason I offer (this CD). (These) songs will lift your spirits, bring encouragement and offer strength for the journey."

More than 40 years later, Holm still is conveying God's message through music.

FASTING WEEK: Please continue to fast for at least one meal the fourth week of every month for the upcoming year..

Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus" (Philippians 4:6-7).

If something is big enough to worry about, it's big enough to pray about. Immediately. Don't wait. Anxiety is a prompting from the Holy Spirit to pray...

I've discovered that I sometimes worry without even realizing that I'm worrying. I'm like the duck that appears to be floating along serenely while below the waterline it's paddling desperately. Impatience or irritability are usually the tip-off that some invisible anxiety is gnawing away at me. I actually have to go to God on these occasions and ask, "Lord, would you help me define what I'm worried about?" Only then am I able to pray about my anxiety. Our worries are a sign of our helplessness. Something is out of our control. Something is wrong and we can't fix it. Something is confusing and we can't figure it out. Something needs to happen and we are powerless to make it happen. Helplessness. Do you feel it? Then pray. I read a definition for prayer some time ago that I really liked: Prayer is helplessness plus faith.

PRAYER; Faithful Father, there are so many times when we struggle with anxious thoughts or feelings instead of recognizing our helplessness before You. Please help us to recognize the prompting from Your Spirit so that we will pray when we sense that life is out of control. It is so comforting to know that You will bring that perfect peace to our hearts when we release our anxiety into Your hands
