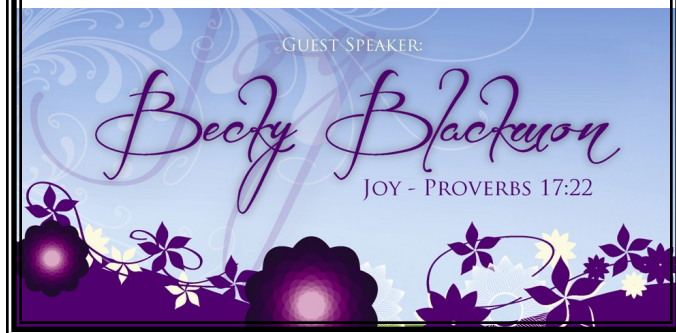

Do They Know?

A friend told me that when she was younger, she worked in an office with another woman. They became friends and often ate lunch together. However, they worked together for four years before they discovered that they were both Christians. Each of them felt shame that her Christianity was not apparent.

We may be tempted to "hide" our Christianity, especially at work. Many work places do not allow open talk about religion except in generic terms. We may be with those who are not Christians, and we don't speak up because we are afraid of being ridiculed. It is safe to keep our mouths shut, do our work, and not become personally involved in the lives of others.

Staying to ourselves is not going to spread the gospel. We need to find a way to reach out to others with the good news. God will help us by giving us opportunities. Even little things like doing small kindnesses, speaking kind words, and lending a sympathetic ear to others' problems can be keys to sharing Christ. They may open locked doors that let others share their hurt and need for a Savior.

Each person must ask himself, "Do others notice a difference in my life? Do I have courage to speak out for God? Am I enough like Jesus that my fellow workers will see Christ in my words and actions?" May each one of us live to let our light shine so that others may glorify God.
