MINISTER'S THOUGHTS

Cletus the Eunuch

John Ed and I were traveling through Montana and tuned the radio to a local station. We were near Sidney, Montana and the weather was bad, so we wanted to know what to expect next. After the weather report, we left the radio on and one of the "big" stories was about the plight of Cletus, the nearly 3,000 pound steer. In Fresno, the big stories are usually drive-by shootings, convenience store robberies, the latest murder in an already elevated murder rate. But, this is not the case in Sidney, Montana. The big story was about Cletus the eunuch (steer).

Cletus was the steer that kept the herd in check and everyone in line. He was the leader and no other bovine challenged his leadership. His owner was very pleased with Cletus and considered him his prize steer. Cletus was nearly 3,000 pounds and the other cattle did not mess with him; they just did what they were told. Cletus, however, had a problem, he was too big to ignore. He was loved, admired, and trusted. You could say he was "outstanding" in his field. (You had to see that one coming!) He still had a problem, he was just too big to ignore. The meat packing business made the owners an offer they could not refuse. Cletus was sold and sent to the meat packers, that was the big story for Sidney, Montana.

Now, why would I tell you the story about Cletus? Because even though Sidney, Montana and Fresno, California are so far apart and so different from each other, they have a very common denominator-- they both have lost souls living in their midst. Yes, living in Montana is peaceful and the big story is a bull that outweighed his usefulness, but it has lost souls. Fresno is not Sidney, we could use a little, okay a lot, less violence and general mayhem, but we also have lost souls in the midst of our city. The church in Sidney must reach out to its citizens and preach the message of the Savior. Fresno is no different.

Preaching to a peaceful area may sound easy, but the gospel can stir people up, just ask Paul the apostle after he left Philippi bruised and beaten. Preaching in Fresno may be dangerous in some neighborhoods, but winning lost souls is worth the risk. James lost his life, as recorded in the Book of Acts, but thousands came to Christ after his death. (Acts 12:2, 3, 24)

Acts chapter 8 has the Ethiopian eunuch, and Sidney, Montana has, well they had, Cletus the eunuch. And, we still have lost souls in both cities. Since we live in Fresno and not the former home of Cletus, let us get back to a serious effort to reach our loved ones, friends and neighbors with the gospel of Jesus. The gospel could not help Cletus, but it will be the difference of eternity for your acquaintances, friends and family. The Book of Acts is designed by God to motivate us to "act", the same type of acts we find in this little gem of a book, world changing acts, soul saving acts and city changing acts. Keep reading, keep praying and keep reaching out to your friends. You never know, you may find someone unique with whom to share the gospel.
