Dear Friend,

It's that time of year again. Temperatures are rising, and along with the warmer weather comes a greater challenge in the issue of modesty. Clothing stores have added their summer collections, and in most cases this means that much of the clothing will come with a lot less material than what could be considered modest. Pools will be another area where immodesty is a great challenge. It's bad enough that we see this problem everywhere we go in today's culture. What's worse is when this issue is present in the church. The statistics make it clear that a large number of men struggle with the temptation to lust, and the last thing they need is for their sisters in Christ to provide a stumbling block for them in this area. It's true that "we may be the only sermon some may see," and so an inappropriately clothed Christian is a rather sad sermon.

1 Timothy 2 and 1 Peter 3 both deal with the issue of outward appearance, and Jesus spoke strongly about those who cause others to stumble in Matthew 18 (and in the parallel text of Luke 17). If the Bible addresses these things, we must do so as well. We aren't fulfilling our duty to each other as Christians if we aren't handling such concerns when they arise.

Less than one hundred years ago secular individuals would have arrested people for wearing many of the outfits worn today (or they would have been thrown into mental institutions). Think about that: secular people would have arrested them. And yet now our culture is so relaxed that Christians find themselves comfortable wearing what two generations ago gotten them arrested. Whether it's fashion, comfort, or whatever else it might be, no reason is good enough to excuse aiding others to indulge in temptation. Anything that is too short, too low-cut, or too-tight needs to be removed from the closet of a Christian. The vast majority of swimwear should be avoided, as well. How can you know what's immodest? Ask. Ask parents, mentors, friends. If you're not sure, it's probably "better to be safe than sorry."

Modesty is not a new issue. We've been dealing with it for decades, but the problem will never just disappear. Each new generation needs to be trained to understand what is modest (for both males and females). Sadly, not all in our congregations have been trained, and the potential for stumbling is present far more than it should be. That can only be an excuse for so long, though. Sooner rather than later we must be proactive in addressing this issue in the church. Fathers and mothers, teach your children a lifestyle of modesty both by what you say and what you do. Preachers, elders, and teachers, don't be afraid to talk about this crucial issue from the pulpit. I know that many parents and leaders are diligent in this area, and I appreciate what you do. May we all keep working together to be lights in a dark world by what we say, what we do, and yes - how we dress.
