Cheryl Rowe— Keep praying for the lost. Love you Lord and all of my sisters and brothers in Christ. Thank you

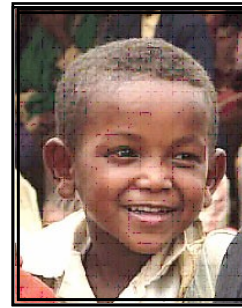

CHANGE FOR CHILDREN



One hundred six children attend the Shinshicho Kindergarten. On the first day of school their parents do the same thing we all did with our children. They build them up and tell them how much fun they are going to have. However, when they walk through the gate of the Kindergarten, something changes. Their smiles turn to flowing tears and they grab their mothers and hold on tightly. They plead with their mothers to stay at school with them. However, within one week, that all changes. In the morning they run through the open gate. They want to be with their new friends and play and learn. The crying still comes but it is when their mother comes for them in the afternoon. What has brought about this change so quickly? Several things. For the first time they have learned many new songs about Jesus. They have fallen in love with their Christian teachers. They know how to write their names. For the first time they know what addition means. They love to participate in the word games and to write new words on the blackboard. Like all kids, they long for recess when they can play on the swings, teeter-totters, slides and merry go rounds. After recess they line up, wash their hands and file into the assembly hall and are served hot tea and a freshly baked bun. For some, this may be their first meal of the day; most have very little food at home. Kindergarten has become their home away from home and they love it.



Berket Getachew is one of the students at the Shinshicho Kindergarten. He is seven years old and has two brothers and two sisters. When he was very young, his father died leaving his mother alone to support the family. They are desperately poor and each day brings a struggle to survive. Berket's older brother is a graduate of the Shinshicho Kindergarten. Like Berket, he was also an outstanding student. The brother attends a government school and is one of the top students in his class. This term was Berket's first at our school. Like his brother, he has already risen to the top in his class. School is his favorite place to be. This attitude will be embedded in his character for the rest of his life. Berket will tell you he enjoys everything at school, but just as quickly he will tell you that bread and tea time is his favorite period. Every time his mother visits the school, she expresses over and over how much she appreciates what has been provided for her family.
